AN ORDINANCE CREATING A NEW SECTION 111.270 (HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES SPECIAL FUND), PART 2 (HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES), (SPECIAL CHAPTER 111 REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES REVENUE FUND FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000 TO THE HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, \$500,000 FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT AND \$500,000 FROM MAYOR'S TASK FORCE CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT; PROVISION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 BUDGET APPROPRIATION FROM THE FUND; PROVIDING OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE FINANCE ADMINISTRATION DIVISION OF THEDEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Creating a new Section 111.270 (Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code. A

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new Section 111.270 (Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER 111. SPECIAL REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS

PART 2. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

Sec. 111.270. - Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund.

There is hereby created a permanent Special Revenue Fund of the City to be known as the Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund (hereinafter the "Fund") into which shall be deposited all payments, contributions, or donations of money, including gifts and grants, received for the purpose of assisting first-time homeless individuals or families to obtain temporary or permanent housing and other basic necessities (e.g. rent and/or utility assistance, security and other housing deposits, food, personal hygiene items, transportation vouchers, etc.). Funds shall be allocated to Duval County residents risk only who are at immediate of becoming homeless. Individuals/families qualified to receive this funding may receive a one-time payment of up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 per calendar year from this Fund. All sums placed into the Fund, which shall include any interest earned or accrued thereon, shall be appropriated by the Council prior to expenditure, and shall be utilized for funding consistent with the purposes of this Fund. These funds shall be appropriated at a minimum on an annual basis in conjunction with the annual budget in an amount not-to-exceed twenty percent (20%) of the available balance within the Fund as of September 30 of the immediately preceding fiscal year. Monies deposited in the Fund shall not lapse but shall carry over to the next fiscal year. This Fund shall be overseen and administered by the Grants and Contract Compliance Division of the Finance and Administration Department. An

annual report of expenditures from this Fund shall be provided to the Council on or before November 30 each year.

Section 2. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein, including renumbering of sections. Such editorial changes and any other changes necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$1,000,000, including \$500,000 from the Council President's Designated Contingency account and \$500,000 from the Mayor's Task Force Contingency account, to provide initial funding for the Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund. This funding will be appropriated to a contingency account for future appropriation by Council.

Section 4. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 3 is to provide initial funding to the Homelessness

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Initiatives Special Revenue Fund. A portion of the Fund dollars, including any accrued interest, will be allocated on an annual basis to programs and services supporting the needs of first time homeless individuals.

Section 5. Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget Appropriation. The Fiscal Year 2024-2025 budget appropriation from the Fund shall be an amount not-to-exceed twenty percent (20%) of the available balance within the Fund as of December 31, 2023. Thereafter, appropriations from the Fund shall be in accordance with Section 111.270, Ordinance Code.

Section 6. Oversight. The Grants and Contract Compliance Division of the Finance and Administration Department shall oversee the Fund and any contracts providing for expenditure of Fund dollars.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
