ORDINANCE 2020-405

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR,
OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO
EXECUTE AND DELIVER, A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND CLAY COUNTY
FOR MEDICAL EXAMINER SERVICES AND REIMBURSEMENT;
PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE MEDICAL EXAMINER'S
OFFICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 406, Florida Statutes, the District IV Medical Examiner has been appointed by the Governor to serve the three county area of Nassau, Clay, and Duval Counties; and

WHEREAS, the District IV Medical Examiner is to be compensated for his or her services by the three counties; and

WHEREAS, Duval County has allocated the annual salary to be paid the District IV Medical Examiner for the full services rendered to all three counties; and

WHEREAS, Clay County should reimburse Duval County for the value of the District IV Medical Examiner's autopsy services it receives; and

WHEREAS, Clay County and Duval County desire to enter into a Cooperative Agreement for Medical Examiner Services under which Clay County is to reimburse Duval County for the value of the District IV Medical Examiner's services it receives; now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Approval and authorization to execute and deliver Cooperative Agreement and other documents. There is hereby

approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, a Cooperative Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and Clay County for Medical Examiner Services and Reimbursement, in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference, and all other documents necessary or appropriate to effectuate the purpose of this ordinance. Reimbursement from Clay County for services provided to Clay County by the District IV Medical Examiner shall be as set forth in Ordinance 2017-370-E, and the term of the agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing October 1, 2020, and ending September 30, 2023. The Medical Examiner will review the fees annually no later than June of each year and should it determined by the Medical Examiner that fees do not sufficiently cover the City's financial exposure, a notice of increase will be given to Clay County with an effective date of October 1, 2021 and/or 2022, thus providing a ninety (90) day notice on increase in fees.

Section 2. Oversight. The Medical Examiner's Office shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
