ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 150 ΑN (ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE), PART (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 150.224 (PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REMOVE LANGUAGE REGARDING PROVIDING A LIST OF LOCATIONS WHERE AN APPLICANT WOULD BE PERMITTED TO PERFORM AND PROVIDING STAGE NAMES USED BY THE PERFORMER; AMENDING CHAPTER 151 (DANCING ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENT CODE), PART (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 151.214 (PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REMOVE LANGUAGE REGARDING PROVIDING A LIST OF LOCATIONS WHERE AN APPLICANT WOULD BE PERMITTED TO PERFORM AND PROVIDING STAGE NAMES USED BY THE PERFORMER; PROVIDING CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

whereas, on February 27, 2023, in the case of Wackos Too, Inc., et al. v. City of Jacksonville, case no. 3:20-cv-00303-TJC-MCR ("Wackos Lawsuit"), the federal judge ruled the City's requirement for performers at adult and dancing entertainment establishments obtain a performer work identification card is constitutional; however, the Court ruled the City is not allowed as part of the application for the work identification card to require the performers to list the locations and stage names where they will be performing;

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WHEREAS, the intent of this legislation is to legally perfect the performer work identification card application requirement by removing the requirement compelling dancer performance location and stage name information and is not meant to address any other provision in Chapters 150 and 151, Ordinance Code addressed by the Court in the Wackos Lawsuit; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 150.224 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and Services Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 150.224 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 150. ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE.

PART 2. ADMINISTRATION

Sec. 150.224. Performer work identification card.

Application for Work Identification Card. An application for a Work Identification Card shall be obtained from the Sheriff. The application shall include: the applicant's full legal name (including maiden name, if applicable); residential address; driver's license number or government issued identification or passport number; date of birth; natural hair and eye color; race; sex; height and weight; place of birth (city, state or country); telephone number; email address; a list of locations of and descriptions of any tattoos; and confirmation that the applicant has not been convicted within the relevant periods of time of any violation listed in subparagraph (1) $_{T}$ of each adult entertainment establishment where applicant will be performing and each stage name used by the applicant

at each location. Each applicant shall affirm through either attestation on the application or presentation of a certificate of completion to the Sheriff that he or she has completed one, free-ofcharge, sex trafficking education program presented by the Polaris (https://polarisproject.org/training/) (approximately Project min. in length) or the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Blue Consequences Training (https://www.dhs.gov/blue-Campaign campaign/course consequences p01) (approximately 15 min. in length). The Sheriff shall maintain and make available to any applicant each sex trafficking education program in the event any applicant does not have online access to the program(s). Additionally, the applicant shall affirm that he or she understands that the Work Identification Card may be immediately revoked if issuance of the card is made illegal through order of any court. The application shall be in writing, signed and notarized, fully completed and submitted to the Sheriff together with the nonrefundable application fee. Each applicant must submit proof of identity at the time the application is submitted. No Work Identification Card shall be issued to any applicant who is under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age. No Work Identification Card shall be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of human trafficking or who is currently on suspension for any violation listed under subsection (1), below. Work Identification Cards are valid for a term of one (1) year. Applicants are required to update his or her application with changes to any of the application information (except height and weight) within 60 days of the change of such information. All current performers shall complete and submit an application for a Work Identification Card within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this section (the "Grace Period"). Upon conclusion of the Grace Period, no performer shall be permitted to perform until a current Work Identification Card is obtained or without a valid copy of the application fee payment check

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or receipt as specified in subparagraph (e), below.

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Section 2. Amending Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment Establishment Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment Establishment Code), Part 2 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 151. DANCING ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENT CODE.

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PART 2. ADMINISTRATION

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Application for Work Identification Card. An application for a Work Identification Card shall be obtained from the Sheriff. The application shall include: the applicant's full legal name (including maiden name, if applicable); residential address; driver's license number, government issued identification or passport number; date of birth; natural hair and eye color; race; sex; height and weight; place of birth (city, state or country); telephone number; email address; a list of locations of and descriptions of any tattoos; and confirmation that the applicant has not been convicted within the relevant periods of time of any violation listed in subparagraph (1)_{τ} and a list of each dancing entertainment establishment where the applicant will be performing and each stage name used by the applicant at each location. Each applicant shall affirm through either attestation on the application or presentation of a certificate of completion to the Sheriff that he or she has completed one, free-ofcharge, sex trafficking education program the Polaris Project (https://polarisproject.org/training/) (approximately 45 min.

length), or the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Blue Campaign Training (https://www.dhs.gov/blue-Consequences campaign/course consequences p01) (approximately 15 min. in length). The Sheriff shall maintain and make available to any Applicant each sex trafficking education program free-of-charge in the event any applicant does not have online access to the program(s). Additionally, the applicant shall affirm that he or she understands that the Work Identification Card may be immediately revoked if issuance of the card is made illegal through order of any court. The application shall be in writing, signed, fully completed and submitted to the Sheriff together with the nonrefundable application fee. Each applicant must submit proof of identity at the time the application is submitted. No Work Identification Card shall be issued to any applicant who is under the age of twenty-one (21) years of age. Work Identification Card shall be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of human trafficking or who is currently on suspension for any violation listed under subsection (1), below. Work Identification Cards are valid for a term of one (1) year. All current performers shall complete and submit an application for a Work Identification Card within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this section (the "Grace Period"). Upon conclusion of the Grace Period, no performer shall be permitted to perform until a current Work Identification Card is obtained or without a valid copy of the application fee payment check or receipt as specified in subparagraph (e), below.

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Section 3. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary changes to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation

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are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the *Ordinance*Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
