AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE 2025 DUVAL COUNTY LOCAL MITIGATION STRATEGY UPDATE; MAKING FINDINGS; ACCEPTING AND ADOPTING THE 2025 DUVAL COUNTY LOCAL MITIGATION STRATEGY ASSIGNING REVIEW, MAINTENANCE, AND COORDINATION RESPONSIBILITIES; PROVIDING FOR PERIODIC REVIEW AND RE-ADOPTION; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT'S EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy (the "LMS") is intended to provide a strategy to mitigate dangers and costs associated with natural and man-made hazards and to provide a priority for mitigation activities before and after a hazardous event occurring in Duval County; and

WHEREAS, the LMS provides a legal basis for FEMA mitigation planning requirements for local governments as a condition of mitigation grant assistance and is required in order for the City to remain eligible to apply for certain types of pre- and post-disaster funding; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Security and Emergency Preparedness Planning Council (SEPPC) serves as the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group; and

WHEREAS, the LMS has been updated in 2025 by the Local Mitigation Strategy Working Group and the Emergency Preparedness Division to

meet federal requirements (the "2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy"); and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy identifies mitigation goals and actions to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property in Duval County from the impacts of future hazards and disasters; and

WHEREAS adoption of the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy by the City Council demonstrates Duval County's commitment to hazard mitigation and achieving the goals outlined in the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy has been reviewed and approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management, as evidenced by the letter dated July 22, 2025, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy was also reviewed and approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as evidenced by the letter dated September 9, 2025, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy has been placed On File with the Legislative Services Division; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. The above-stated recitals are true and correct, and by this reference are incorporated herein and are adopted as findings of the Council.

Section 2. Acceptance, Adoption, Review, Maintenance, Coordination, Review and Re-adoption. The 2025 Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy, in substantially the same form as has been placed On File with the Legislative Services Division, is hereby accepted and adopted as the Duval County Local Mitigation Strategy.
