7 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$45,000,000 FROM THE 8 SELF INSURANCE FUND - TRANSFER FROM RETAINED 9 EARNINGS ACCOUNT, TO PROVIDE \$30,000,000 TO THE DOWNTOWN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND, DOWNTOWN 10 11 RIVERFRONT RESIDENTIAL INCENTIVES CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT, TO MAKE FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR FUTURE 12 13 APPROPRIATION FOR DEVELOPMENT/REDEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, FOR 14 15 SEVERAL PARCELS LOCATED ON THE CITY'S DOWNTOWN RIVERFRONT, TO PROVIDE \$12,000,000 TO A SPECIAL 16 17 COUNCIL CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR VARIOUS COUNTYWIDE PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES, 18 INCLUDING BUT NOT 19 LIMITED TO, WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AT FLORIDA 20 STATE COLLEGE AT JACKSONVILLE, THE JACKSONVILLE 21 22 UNIVERSITY YOUTH SPORTS PROJECT, AND THE 23 DOWNTOWN PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION PROGRAM, AND TO PROVIDE \$3,000,000 TO A SPECIAL 24 COUNCIL CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDING 25 26 FOR COUNTYWIDE PROJECTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT 27 LIMITED TO, AFFORDABLE HOUSING; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER TO FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026; WAIVING THE 28 29 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS OF SECTION 128.311 30 (DIVIDENDS), SUBPART B (SELF-INSURANCE PROGRAM 31 FUNDING), PART 3 (SELF-INSURANCE PROGRAM),

CHAPTER 128 (RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAM), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO A DOWNTOWN RIVERFRONT RESIDENTIAL INCENTIVES CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

8 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, 9 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 10 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 11 listed in subsection (b):

19 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

20 The funding above represents an appropriation of 21 \$45,000,000 from the Self Insurance Fund - Transfer From 22 Retained Earnings account, to place \$30,000,000 in the 23 Downtown Economic Development Fund - Downtown Riverfront 24 Residential Incentives Contingency account, to make funds appropriation 25 for future available for 26 development/redevelopment incentives for several parcels 27 located on the City's downtown riverfront as more 2.8 particularly described herein. The remaining \$15,000,000 29 will be split between two Special Council Contingency accounts, including \$12,000,000 into a Contingency to make 30 31 funds available for various countywide initiatives and

programs, including but not limited to, workforce development, capital projects at Florida State College at Jacksonville ("FSCJ"), the Jacksonville University (JU) Youth Sports Program, and the Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program ("DPRP"), with the remaining \$3,000,000 being placed in a Contingency for other countywide activities, including but not limited to, creation and/or development of affordable housing.

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9 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 10 Section 1 is to transfer the City's portion of the unassigned balance and a portion of the City's reserve for workers' compensation from 11 Self Insurance retained earnings. This reserve amount is over and 12 above the liability amount booked pursuant to the actuarial study 13 provided to the City. A portion of these funds will be placed in a 14 contingency account within the Downtown Economic Development Fund for 15 future appropriation by the City Council for incentives that encourage 16 development/redevelopment downtown, including but not limited to, the 17 development/redevelopment of several parcels located on the downtown 18 riverfront as depicted on Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised 19 Exhibit 2, Rev Map, June 17, 2025 - Finance", attached hereto and 20 21 incorporated herein by this reference. Specific guidelines for the 22 use of these funds for the development/redevelopment of the parcels 23 depicted in **Revised Exhibit 2** shall be approved by the City Council through future legislation. However, the Council's intent is that the 24 25 sites will be used primarily for residential uses with appropriate 26 secondary mixed-uses. The remaining \$15,000,000 will be set aside in a Special Council Contingency account to be allocated to other 27 28 countywide initiatives, including \$12,000,000 for various projects 29 and programs, including but not limited to workforce development, capital projects at FSCJ, the JU Youth Sports project, and DPRP 30 31 initiatives and \$3,000,000 for affordable housing. This appropriation 1 does not affect contributions made to the Self Insurance Fund by the 2 other plan participants.

3 Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall
4 not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2025-2026.

Waiving the Conflicting Provisions of Section 5 Section 4. 128.311, Ordinance Code. The conflicting provisions of Section 6 7 128.311 (Dividends), Subpart B (Self-Insurance Program Funding), Part 3 (Self-Insurance Program), Chapter 128 (Risk Management Program), 8 9 Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for the transfer of funds 10 from Self Insurance retained earnings to the Downtown Riverfront Residential Incentives Contingency account. This waiver is necessary 11 because Section 128.311, Ordinance Code, requires dividends to be 12 distributed back to plan participants based on the amount of dividends 13 over the reserve levels. The City has accumulated reserves well beyond 14 what should be needed to cover a shortfall within a given year and 15 would therefore like to put this excess funding to use. 16

17 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 18 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 19 without the Mayor's signature.
