There was a lengthy discussion on this bill. CM Dennis was in attendance and spoke about the lifelong consequences from a marijuana criminal conviction record (they can be barred from employment, denied federal financial student aid, welfare/ food stamps and may be removed from public housing); hemp legalization and racial disparities in marijuana arrests and sentencing. This bill offers JSO the option of serving a civil citation for the possession of small amount of marijuana to avoid a criminal record. CM Gaffney spoke against the bill, in that in his opinion there is no acceptable level of marijuana usage.

As Substituted:

- Updates the terms to refer to cannabis (rather than marijuana) and includes a definition consistent with changes in state law which took effect on July 1, 2019
- Ties the fine structure for the civil citation to Chapter 609 fine schedule (Code Enforcement) rather than a separate fine schedule
- Specifies that fine revenue will be deposited into the Duval County Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Trust Fund

The appropriation will provide funds to cover a year of rent at a new warehouse storage facility, as the current landlord has sold the existing storage facility. Farm Share provides fresh food to parts of the city deemed to be food deserts, 9 million pounds of food was distributed locally last year. If funding is not found for the new warehouse, Farm Share would have to relocate to their Quincy warehouse which would make distribution in Jacksonville logistically challenging.
