RESOLUTION 2024-473

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF JUNE TO BE CARIBBEAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in June 2005, the U.S. House of Representatives unanimously adopted House Concurrent Resolution 71 recognizing the significance of Caribbean people and their descendants in the history and culture of the United States. On February 14, 2006, the resolution similarly passed the U.S. Senate, culminating a two-year, bipartisan and bicameral effort, and a Proclamation was issued by President George W. Bush on June 6, 2006 declaring June to be Caribbean American Heritage Month in the United States; and

WHEREAS, there is no single Caribbean American identity, as the mix of cultures, languages, and religions alive across the United States and the islands reflects the diversity of spirit that defines the American story. Meanwhile, our countries are bound by common values and a shared history — overcoming the yoke of colonialism and charting new opportunities across borders and generations; and

WHEREAS, during Caribbean-American Heritage Month, we celebrate the achievements and dreams of the millions of people of Caribbean origin now living in the United States while honoring the shared history of joy and perseverance that has united and enriched life across our region for centuries; and

WHEREAS, Jacksonville, a city in which 3.5% of the population claims ancestry from one of the Caribbean countries and in which 2.2% of foreign-born persons who have become American citizens in our

county came from Caribbean countries, is enlivened by the presence of many citizens of Caribbean descent whose businesses, foods, dress, music, dance, art, and zest for life make our city a more diverse, exciting place in which to live; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby declares the month of June to be Caribbean American Heritage Month in Jacksonville in conjunction with the observances nationwide and encourages all citizens to become better acquainted with the histories, cultures and achievements of our neighbors to the south and to enjoy all the enrichment that they have to offer our city.

Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that June is being designated as Caribbean American Heritage Month nationally, and the City Council desires to show its support for this recognition in a timely manner.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
