## RESOLUTION 2021-722

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING BILL WARNER FOR HIS COUNTLESS BUSINESS, MILITARY AND CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS TO JACKSONVILLE AND NORTHEAST FLORIDA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Jacksonville resident Bill Warner, a lifelong car and racing enthusiast, attended public schools in Duval County, earned his Engineering degree at The Citadel in 1966, and then began three simultaneous careers (1) managing his family's industrial filter business, (2) retiring as a Major after 30 years with the Florida Air National Guard, and (3) developing his life-long interest writing and photographing sports cars, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warner's was named 1970 Photographer of the Year by the Sports Car Club of America and earned similar prestigious awards. His exceptional writing ability led to his award-winning career in the automotive media. His pictures and articles have appeared in national and international publications, including Road and Track (since 1971); and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warner is the author/co-author of historic automotive books, including "The Other Side of the Fence, Six Decades of Motorsport Photography" (2021) and "Cuba's Car Culture" (2016)

WHEREAS, Bill Warner is an internationally known automotive expert judge, entertaining speaker, and racing driver. He has participated in well-known national and international racing events, including the famous "Sea to Shining Sea" Cannonball (later a movie) and the "One Lap of America" Cannonball. In addition to racing, he restores and collects historically interesting classic sports and

race cars; and

WHEREAS, his interest in classic vehicles, combined with his "golden rolodex" of industry legend racing drivers, designers and manufacturers, led to his founding in 1996 of The Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, one of the great automotive events of its type in the world. The event annually attracts thousands of local residents and a star-studded international audience of auto enthusiasts, race drivers, collectors and media, and was several times been named "Motoring Event of the Year" by Octane magazine; and

WHEREAS, in in its 25-year history the Concours has raised over \$3.7 million for Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, Spina Bifida Jacksonville, the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society and the Shop With Cops Program of Fernandina Beach and Nassau County, which represents just a portion of the contribution that Bill Warner has made to the betterment of the community; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City hereby honors and commends Bill Warner for his countless business, military and charitable contributions to Jacksonville and the Northeast Florida, and thanks him for his generosity. The Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance is a world class event that effectively introduces our First Coast to an international audience.
