COUNCIL RULE 4.505 DISRUPTION OF MEETING

Any person who disrupts a regular meeting of the City Council, standing committees, special or select committees, sub-committees or any other public meeting presided over by a City Council Member may be forthwith barred, removed, or otherwise ejected, in the discretion of the presiding officer, from further attendance at that meeting. If necessary, due to the nature of the disruption, the audience may be cleared from the Council Chambers or meeting location in the discretion of the presiding officer.

Any person who refuses to leave the City Council Chamber may be subject to arrest.

Disruption of a meeting includes the following types of behaviors:

- 1) Any form of political campaigning or electioneering regarding a specific candidate or group of candidates in City elections;
- 2) Impeding the orderly progress of the meeting by shouting, yelling, whistling, chanting, singing, dancing, clapping, foot stomping, snapping fingers, cheering, jeering, using artificial noise makers or musical instruments, waving signs of any size, or engaging in any other display of excessive noise, sounds, or movement;
- 3) Displaying or waving signs of any sort, except where used to support the speaker's presentation at the podium, and only where the sign is 21 inches by 21 inches or smaller in size and cannot be displayed in a manner which unreasonably obstructs the view of the dais for any member of the audience, regardless of message;
- 4) Audible noise from cellphones or other electronic devices;
- 5) Consumption of alcohol or controlled substances;
- 6) Making vulgar or offensive remarks or gestures, or using threatening language or gestures, including but not limited to pantomiming discharging a firearm, choking, or throat-cutting;
- 7) Refusing to stop speaking when his or her time has expired or is otherwise directed by the presiding officer to do so due to disruptive behavior as described herein;
- 8) Returning to the meeting after having been removed or ejected, or attempting to do so.

Annie Battle provided an overview of her background. She stated that many elders are not aware of the benefits available to them and tries her best to inform them of those.

CM Miller stated the Committee was unable to get attendance records and asked Ms. Battle to share her attendance record. She recalled only missing one meeting during her prior term due to a death in the family.

CM Amaro asked Garrett Dennis from the Administration why there were no records of attendance. Mr. Dennis directed the question to Tourea Robinson, the Chief of Senior Services. Ms. Robinson stated that they did have attendance records for 2025, but they were unable to obtain records for 2024 from the previous Executive Director of the Council on Elder Affairs, who left in the middle of 2024.

Joshua Garrison provided an overview of his background, which included site utility construction. He stated that he was currently a land development manager and had worked with the Northeast Florida Builders Association, as well as previously serving on the Planning Commission. He stated he believes in property rights.

CM White thanked Mr. Garrison and stated he was the perfect person to be on the commission.

CM Salem asked why he had left the Planning Commission before. He stated that he had served for about 4 or 5 years and wanted to work with the Downtown Investment Authority. He added that the Administration wanted to introduce new blood at the DIA, which is why he seeks to be appointed to the Planning Commission now.

CM Boylan thanked Mr. Garrison for his service and requested to be added as a co-sponsor.

Mr. Dennis stated that Mr. Garrison was an example of a nominee put forth by the Council for a vacant seat, demonstrating the Administration's commitment to working with the Council on appointments.

CM Gay asked if Mr. Garrison could objectively examine zoning matters and consider the rights of adjacent properties. Mr. Garrison stated that he would, noting that there are both good and bad developments, as well as ways to achieve a compromise. CM Gay said he would support the nominee.

Chair Miller stated he has known Mr. Garrison for some time and that he was a great candidate for the Commission.
