Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), through its Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program, provides formula grants to jurisdictions to address housing assistance and related supportive services for low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families. HOPWA funds may be used for a wide range of housing, social services, program planning, and development costs. These include, but are not limited to, the acquisition; rehabilitation; or new construction of housing units; costs for facility operations; rental assistance; and short-term payments to prevent homelessness. An essential component in providing housing assistance for this targeted special needs population is the coordination and delivery of support services. Consequently, HOPWA funds also may be used for services including (but not limited to) assessment and case management, substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment, nutritional services, job training and placement assistance, and assistance with daily living.

The funds being appropriated within this legislation will be spent towards activities that meet the stated program goals. The City does not contribute general funds to the administration of this program and any positions are authorized and funded through the grant.

The City of Jacksonville must expend all grant funds within 36 months after HUD signs the grant agreement. Further obligation and expenditure requirements are specified at 24 CFR 574.

The City of Jacksonville is not required to match HOPWA funds.
