ORDINANCE 2025-652-E

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE; RENAMING A ROADWAY CURRENTLY IDENTIFIED AS "MANNING CEMETERY ROAD" TO "SOLOMON ROAD" IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 12; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AND TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DIVISIONS, FOR PROCESSING AND COORDINATION WITH 911 EMERGENCY, THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, THE U.S. POSTAL SERVICE, AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Addressing Section of the Public Works Department, Development Services Division, received notifications from the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department ("JFRD") and the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office that properties with a Manning Cemetery Road address have been addressed in a manner that causes delays in the emergency response system; and

WHEREAS, the addressing issue being corrected via this road renaming stems from incorrect data being entered in the City's addressing system and other mapping systems, including numerous addresses that were addressed from incorrect roads, addresses that were out of sequence, roads that were improperly named, and various map sources such as Google displaying different versions of the area

 addresses, all of which prevented JFRD from quickly responding to an emergency call received in the area; and

WHEREAS, this concern was presented to the 911 Emergency Addressing and Advisory Committee ("911 Committee") on January 3, 2024, to determine whether an address change was appropriate to correct the issue; and

WHEREAS, on January 3, 2024, the 911 Committee voted to rename "Manning Cemetery Road" to "Solomon Road" to allow emergency services to promptly identify, locate and access the road in the event of an emergency and a copy of the Minutes of said meeting have been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, the 911 Committee subsequently held several additional public meetings on March 6, 2024, May 9, 2024, June 5, 2024, July 11, 2024, November 6, 2024, January 8, 2025, and June 4, 2025, regarding the Manning Cemetery Road street renaming and discussed updates and inquiries from affected residents; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Minutes of each public meeting have been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Divisions; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2024, Council Member Randy White held a community meeting at the Chaffee Road Library Branch to discuss the issue concerning the addresses and the proposed new road name, and a copy of the Minutes of said community meeting have been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, on May 9, 2024, the Addressing Section staff presented an update to the 911 Committee regarding the April 29th community meeting, particularly, relating to naming three streets, renaming Manning Cemetery Road and assigning new addresses to the affected properties; and

WHEREAS, although the City is not required to meet the 75% threshold pursuant to Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, for City-

initiated requests, the Addressing Section mailed notification letters on July 1, 2024, and November 4, 2024, to affected property owners notifying them of the proposed renaming and requesting the property owners to indicate their consent or objection to the proposed street renaming and a copy of the notification letters have been placed **Revised On File** with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, on February 3, 2025, the Addressing Section mailed Second Notice letters to affected property owners who failed to respond to the November 1, 2024, notification letters and a copy of the February 3, 2025, letters have been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, in addition, the Community Planning Division, Historic Preservation Section of the Planning and Development Department issued a Memorandum with a recommendation to approve the renaming of "Manning Cemetery Road" to "Solomon Road" and a copy of said Memorandum has been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, on April 23, 2025, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission held a public meeting during which it considered this matter and voted to accept the Historic Preservation Section's recommendation to rename "Manning Cemetery Road" to "Solomon Road" and a copy of the relevant portions of the transcript of said meeting has been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division; and

WHEREAS, upon this legislation becoming effective the City will install a new street sign at the affected roadway segment to reflect "Solomon Road" as the designated street name; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to correct this matter by renaming the affected portion of "Manning Cemetery Road" to "Solomon Road"; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The portion of roadway currently identified as "Manning Cemetery Road" is hereby renamed to "Solomon Road" by which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter known and designated. Copies of various maps depicting Solomon Road and the affected addresses have been placed Revised On File with the Legislative Services Division.

Division. The Chief of the Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to send a copy of this Ordinance, once enacted, to the Public Works Department, Development Services and Traffic Engineering Divisions, for processing, implementation, and coordination with 911 Emergency, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, the U.S. Postal Service, and other affected agencies and organizations.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
