AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$444,132 FROM THE BUILDING INSPECTION FUND (15104) FUND BALANCE, \$24,897 IN SUPERVISION ALLOCATION FROM BUILDING INSPECTION FUND TO THE GENERAL FUND, \$24,897 FROM THE GENERAL FUND RESILIENCY OFFICE PERMANENT AND PROBATIONARY SALARIES ACCOUNT, AND \$18,940 IN INTERNAL SERVICE REVENUE WITHIN THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGIES FUND (53101) TO FUND SALARIES, BENEFITS, AND INTERNAL SERVICE CHARGES WITHIN THE BUILDING INSPECTION FUND FOR TEN FULL-TIME POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY 24-044; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING (1) AN INCREASE TO THE EMPLOYEE CAP FOR THE BUILDING INSPECTION DIVISION OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FROM ONE HUNDRED EIGHTEEN (118) TO ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR (124) IN ORDER TO ALLOW FOR THE ADDITION OF TWO (2) NEW PERMIT SENIOR POSITIONS, ASSISTANT TWO (2) PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER POSITIONS, AND TWO (2) NEW BUILDING PLANS EXAMINER SENIOR POSITIONS, AND (2) AN INCREASE TO THE EMPLOYEE CAP FOR THE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES DIVISION OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FROM FORTY-EIGHT (48) TO FIFTY-TWO (52), IN ORDER TO ALLOW FOR THE

ADDITION OF ONE (1) NEW CITY PLANNER III POSITION, ONE (1) NEW PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER POSITION, ONE (1) NEW ASSOCIATE ENGINEER POSITION, AND ONE (1) NEW TRAFFIC TECHNICIAN PRINCIPAL POSITION, ALL WITHIN THE BUILDING INSPECTION FUND (FUND 15104), AS INITIATED BY R.C. 24-035; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$444,132 from the Building Inspection Fund (15104) fund balance, \$24,897 in Supervision Allocation from the Building Inspection Fund to the General Fund, \$24,897 from the General Fund Resiliency Office Permanent and Probationary Salaries account, and \$18,940 in Internal Service Revenue within the Information Technologies Fund (53101) to fund salaries, benefits, and internal service charges within the Building Inspection Fund for ten full-time positions.

Section 2. Approval and Authorization of Increase to Employee Caps and Authorization of Positions. There is hereby

approved an increase to the employee cap for the Building Inspection Division of the Planning and Development Department within the Building Inspection Fund (Fund 15104) from one hundred eighteen (118) to one hundred twenty-four (124) in order to allow for the addition of two (2) new permit assistant senior positions, two (2) new professional engineer positions, and two (2) new building plans examiner senior positions, and an increase to the employee cap for the Development Services Division of the Planning and Development Department within the Building Inspection Fund (Fund 15104) from forty-eight (48) to fifty-two (52), in order to allow for the addition of one (1) new city planner III position, one (1) new professional engineer position, one (1) new associate engineer position, and one (1) new traffic technician principal position, all within the Building Inspection Fund (Fund 15104), as more fully described in R.C. 24-035, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Pursuant to the Mayor's Transition Committee report and recommendations, the Planning and Development Department is working to reduce the wait time and review time for permits and civil plan review submissions. These additional positions will help to reduce plan review and permit processing times to achieve a higher level of customer service. Additional appropriations are not necessary to fund these positions for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
