A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE CITY COUNCIL'S CONDOLENCES TO THE VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS OF THE AUGUST 26, 2023, DOLLAR GENERAL SHOOTING AND THEIR FAMILIES, PUBLICLY CONDEMNING RACISM, DISCRIMINATION, BIGOTRY, BIAS AND HATEFUL ACTIONS AND SPEECH OF ANY KIND, AND CALLING FOR THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY TO UNITE IN THE EFFORT TO ERADICATE HATE CRIMES AND TO PROMOTE TOLERANCE, DIVERSITY AND EQUAL TREATMENT FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on Saturday, August 26, 2023, the Jacksonville community was devastated when a fatal shooting of three Black residents occurred at a Dollar General store in New Town; and

WHEREAS, Angela Michelle Carr, Anolt Joseph "AJ" Laguerre, Jr. and Jerrald De'Shaun Gallion were the victims of a racially motivated hate crime when a white gunman entered the Dollar General and shot several rounds at the victims using a handgun and rifle that bore swastika markings; and

WHEREAS, this shooting was a racially motivated action and
crime targeted against Black persons; and

WHEREAS, racist acts and decisions based on prejudice and bias only serve to create discord and lead to increases in discrimination and disparate outcomes in housing, education, employment, and criminal justice; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to publicly condemn actions of bias and hate in all forms as they have no place in our community, and silence and inaction in the face of such actions is an unacceptable response; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution serves as a starting point and acknowledges the need to commence the necessary and serious work and action that must be taken to generate transformational change in our community; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council desires to honor the victims and survivors of the Dollar General shooting and their families and encourages the community to question, peacefully challenge and appropriately report hateful acts whenever they are seen, heard or encountered. The Council publicly condemns racism, discrimination, bigotry, bias and hateful actions and speech of any kind and is committed to identifying opportunities and initiatives aimed at increasing community awareness and safeguarding Jacksonville's diverse community from further actions of hate and prejudice. The Jacksonville community, including its for-profit, not-for-profit and faith-based partners, is encouraged to unite in this effort to eradicate hate crimes and to promote tolerance, diversity and equal treatment for all individuals, regardless of their race or ethnicity.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
