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## ORDINANCE 2024-744-E

8 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$143,710 FROM THE 9 GENERAL FUND OPERATING HISTORIC STANTON REHAB CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO THE HISTORIC STANTON 10 REHAB SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO PRIVATE 11 ORGANIZATIONS ACCOUNT WITHIN THE GRANTS AND 12 CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION TO 13 PROVIDE ADDITIONAL GRANT FUNDS TO HISTORIC STANTON, INC. 14 FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE HISTORIC STANTON SCHOOL 15 BUILDING LOCATED AT 521 WEST ASHLEY STREET; 16 PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER; APPROVING, 17 AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE 18 CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER A 19 20 SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE GRANT AGREEMENT FOR 21 HISTORIC STANTON SCHOOL BUILDING BETWEEN THE 22 CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND HISTORIC STANTON, INC., TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM INDEBTEDNESS BY \$143,710 23 AND TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE AGREEMENT TO 24 25 SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION; 26 27 REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 28

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2021-382-E appropriated \$300,000 to a designated contingency account for Historic Stanton, Inc. to be used

1 for building improvements at the historic Stanton School located at
2 521 West Ashley Street in downtown Jacksonville; and

2022-93-е 3 WHEREAS, Ordinance subsequently appropriated \$156,290 from said contingency account, authorized execution of a 4 Grant Agreement for Historic Stanton School Building (the "Grant 5 Agreement") providing the terms and conditions for expenditure of 6 7 City funds for completion of improvements to the historic Stanton School, and authorized carryover of the remaining contingency funds 8 9 in the amount of \$143,710 to September 30, 2023; and

10 WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2023-610-E the Council 11 subsequently authorized the carryover of all remaining funds set 12 aside for this project (\$200,000), including \$143,710 remaining in 13 the Historic Stanton Rehab Contingency account and \$56,290 remaining 14 in the Historic Stanton Rehab Subsidies and Contributions to Private 15 Orgs account, to September 30, 2024; and

WHEREAS, to date Historic Stanton, Inc. has expended \$156,290 of the City funds for improvements to the historic Stanton School building and has requested the City make the remaining \$143,710 available for additional improvements as more specifically described herein and in keeping with the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

23 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, 24 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated 25 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 26 listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$143,710 from the General Fund Operating Historic Stanton Rehab Contingency account to the Historic Stanton Rehab Subsidies and Contributions to Private Organizations account within the Grants and Contract Compliance Division to provide funds to Historic Stanton, Inc. for additional improvements to the historic Stanton School building as described herein.

10 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional grant funding to Historic Stanton, 11 Inc. for building improvements to the historic Stanton School. 12 Specifically, Historic Stanton, Inc. proposes to use these funds to 13 reinstall electric service to the building, to secure the exterior 14 mortar and brick on the building, and to conduct interior remediation 15 work on the first floor as more fully described in Revised Exhibit 16 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Scope, September 16, 2024 -17 NCSPHS" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. 18

19 Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall
20 not lapse but shall carryover to September 30, 2025.

21 Section 4. Approval and Authorization to Execute Second 22 Amendment to Grant Agreement. There is hereby approved, and the 23 Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby 24 authorized to execute and deliver, a second amendment to the Grant 25 Agreement for Historic Stanton School Building between the City of 26 Jacksonville and Historic Stanton, Inc. (the "Grant Agreement") to 27 increase the maximum indebtedness by \$143,710, for a new total maximum 28 indebtedness not-to-exceed \$300,000, to extend the term of the Grant 29 Agreement to September 30, 2025, to update the payment schedule and 30 to attach the revised scope of work as described in Revised Exhibit 31 2, with all other terms and conditions remaining unchanged. This

extension will be retroactive to October 1, 2024, to ensure there is
 no lapse in the contract term.

3 Section 5. Oversight. The Grants and Contract Compliance 4 Division of the Department of Finance shall continue to oversee the 5 Grant Agreement described herein.

Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant 6 Section 6. 7 to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the 8 9 funds appropriated herein from the Historic Stanton Rehab Contingency 10 account will lapse to the General Fund on September 30, 2024. The intent is to ensure these funds remain available for improvements to 11 the historic Stanton School building in accordance with the Grant 12 Agreement with Historic Stanton, Inc. 13

14 Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 15 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 16 without the Mayor's signature.
