8 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; 9 APPROPRIATING \$3,311,829.00, WHICH INCLUDES \$215,577.00 REPROGRAMED 10 ΙN FUNDING AND \$3,096,252.00 IN ANNUAL HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES 11 FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS (HOPWA) PROGRAM GRANT 12 FUNDING FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND 13 URBAN DEVELOPMENT, TO PROVIDE HOUSING ASSISTANCE 14 AND RELATED SUPPORTIVE SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE 15 LOW-INCOME PERSONS LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS AND 16 THEIR FAMILIES WITHIN DUVAL COUNTY, AS INITIATED 17 BY REVISED B.T. 26-004; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION 18 FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT 19 FUNDS AS MORE 20 PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE 21 MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND 22 DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE AWARD; 23 APPROVING A PROGRAM MANAGER POSITION, AS 24 INITIATED BY R.C. 26-003; PROVIDING FOR AN 25 EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2025-2026 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b): 1 (Revised B.T. 26-004, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1, labeled 2 as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev B.T. 26-004, June 16, 2025 - NCSPHS" and 3 incorporated herein by this reference):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

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9 The funding above is an appropriation of \$3,311,829.00, 10 which includes \$215,577.00 in reprogramed funding and \$3,096,252.00 in annual grant funds from the U.S. 11 Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for 12 the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS ("HOPWA") 13 program. The HOPWA program is administered by the Housing 14 and Community Development Division and was established to 15 provide housing assistance and related supportive services 16 17 to eligible low-income persons living with HIV/AIDS and their families. The HOPWA program grant funds must be 18 expended within 36 months after HUD signs the grant 19 20 agreement.

21 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 22 Section 1 is to provide funding for housing assistance and related supportive services to eligible low-income persons living with 23 24 HIV/AIDS and their families. The HOPWA program provides funding that 25 can be used for a wide range of housing, social services, program 26 planning, and development cost expenditures for eligible persons and their families. Housing assistance may include the acquisition, 27 28 rehabilitation or new construction of housing units, costs for 29 facility operations, rental assistance, and short-term payments to 30 prevent homelessness. In addition, an essential component to providing housing assistance for this targeted, special needs 31

population is the coordination and delivery of supportive services. 1 Consequently, HOPWA funds may also be used for services that include, 2 3 but are not limited to, assessment and case management, substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment, nutritional services, job 4 training and placement assistance, and assistance with daily living 5 activities. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed 6 7 uses of HOPWA funds is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev Sched, June 16, 2025 - NCSPHS" and 8 9 incorporated herein by this reference. A copy of the grant award 10 letter from HUD is attached hereto as **Exhibit 4** and incorporated herein by this reference. 11

12 Section 3. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds. 13 In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an 14 award of HOPWA funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next 15 eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied 16 by the Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission for 17 award of HOPWA funds.

18 Section 4. Execution of Documents. The Mayor, or her 19 designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to 20 execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to effectuate the 21 purpose set forth in Section 2 above.

22 Section 5. Approval of Position. There is hereby approved 23 the Program Manager position more fully described in R.C. 26-003, 24 attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this 25 reference. Said position is fully funded by HOPWA grant dollars and 26 will provide services in support of the HOPWA program.

27 Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 28 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 29 without the Mayor's signature.
