A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF FORMER CITY EMPLOYEE LARRY ALEXANDER; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Lawrence James "Larry" Alexander, a Jacksonville native, graduated from New Stanton High School in 1966 and earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from Florida A&M University, where he was a proud member of the Marching 100, the FAMU Concert Band, and a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Alexander returned to Jacksonville after graduation to begin a stellar career with the City of Jacksonville as Project Director and later Director of the Walnut House Ex-Offender Program. His career advanced in local government when, in 1980, Mayor Jake Godbold appointed him as one of the first Black individuals in Jacksonville's history to receive a city appointment, as Chief of Advertising and Promotions in the Department of Recreation and Public Affairs; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Alexander excelled in that position and received letters of commendation from the mayor for excellent performance. In 1987, Mayor Godbold appointed him to the position of Deputy Director of the Recreation and Public Affairs Department, from which he retired in 1997 after twenty-six years of service to the city that he loved; and

WHEREAS, Larry Alexander was known by all as a sports fanatic, and was a very fine tournament-level tennis player and enthusiastic golfer and pool player. He also loved music and treasured time spent

with family and friends; and

WHEREAS, during his retirement years, Mr. Alexander took great pride in developing and maintaining his more than 100-acre farm in North Florida with its sizeable pond stocked with fish. He also became involved in the purchase, rehabilitation and sale of single and multifamily properties. As the years passed, he became a grandfather and that became his passion; and

WHEREAS, with his recent passing, the City of Jacksonville has lost a man of strength, positivity and unassuming manner who lived a life of quiet leadership with great humor and dignity; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of Lawrence James "Larry" Alexander and his devotion to the city and the people of Jacksonville, particularly through his nearly three decades of service to the city government. His contributions to his community will be long and gratefully remembered by all who had the honor to know him.
