ORDINANCE 2024-198-E

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 CATEGORIES OF MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT APPROPRIATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, AND ESTABLISHING A RECOMMENDED FUNDING AMOUNT FOR THE MICRO-GRANT PILOT PROGRAM; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Public Service Grant Council met on February 12, 2024, to approve the fiscal year 2024-2025 categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs; a copy of the minutes of said meeting is attached hereto as Exhibit 1; and

19 WHEREAS, the City Council, having considered the 20 recommendation of the Public Service Grant Council, hereby 21 establishes the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs for 22 the 2024-2025 fiscal year; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

24 Section 1. Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs 25 Pursuant to Section 118.804 (Categories of Most Established. 26 Vulnerable Persons and Needs), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 27 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, the following categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs, as recommended by the Public Service 2.8 29 Grant (PSG) Council in the letter attached hereto as Exhibit 2, are 30 hereby established for the 2024-2025 fiscal year:

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2024-2025 Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs

- Acute. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 30%.
- Prevention and Diversion. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 40%.
- 3. Self-Sufficiency and Stability. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 30%.
- 4. Micro-Grant Pilot Program. 8 The percentage of 9 available funding to this category shall be 0% of the 10 Public Service Grant Council budgeted funds due to the funds for the micro-grants pilot program being 11 identified and appropriated separately from the 12 normal Public Service Grant Council award/budget 13 14 process.

Detailed definitions of each of the categories of Most
Vulnerable Persons and Needs are set forth in Exhibit 3.

Public Service Grants to Serve Categories of 17 Section 2. Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Public Service Grants made by the 18 19 City Council shall be used to exclusively serve the categories of 20 Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Where a category contains more 21 funding than applied for, the excess funding for that population may 22 be applied to another category that contains less funding than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than applied for, 23 24 the excess funding shall be divided among the underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all 25 26 underfunded categories is the denominator and the amount underfunded 27 in any one category is the numerator.

28 Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 29 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 30 without the Mayor's signature.
