ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A DEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICT FOR THE COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES ALONG 103RD STREET FROM BLANDING BOULEVARD TO CECIL COMMERCE CENTER; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION DISTRIBUTE PETITIONS TO COMMERCIAL TO AND BUSINESS OWNERS WITHIN THE PROPOSED WONDERLAND DISTRICT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is the City of Jacksonville's intent to establish a special dependent district consisting of those commercial properties along 103rd Street, between Blanding Boulevard and Cecil Commerce Center, the "Wonderland District", consistent with various goals, objectives and policies set forth in the 2045 Comprehensive Plan concerning revitalization of run-down and/or under-utilized commercial areas; and

WHEREAS, the potential Wonderland District would be a tool for economic vitality, neighborhood identity, and sustainable development by fostering economic growth, enhancing property values and promoting commercial revitalization on Jacksonville's Westside connecting with City Council Districts 9, 12 & 14; and

WHEREAS, the Wonderland District could also be used to leverage other grants and philanthropic funds for the betterment of those properties located along the Wonderland Corridor; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Jacksonville that the Wonderland District would raise funds through special assessments on those properties located within the Wonderland District;

WHEREAS, it is intent of the Council to provide an initial infusion of \$750,000 (from district Council Members Community 9, 12 & 14 Benefits Agreement funds) to assist with the initial creation and start-up of the Wonderland District; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the City Council to determine the community interest in establishing the Wonderland District; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Directive to Chief of Legislative Services

Division. The Chief of the Legislative Services Division is hereby directed to distribute petitions attached as Exhibit 1, to all of the owners of commercial property within the proposed Wonderland District, as set forth in Exhibit 2, in order to determine the support of the establishment of the Wonderland District.

Section 2. Directive to Council Secretary/Director. The petitions shall be returned to the Council Secretary/Director. The Council Secretary/Director is directed to report the results to the City Council. The report shall indicate the number of petitions in favor, number of petitions opposed and the percentage of the total number of businesses that responded.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
