

1 Introduced by the Council President at the request of the Mayor:  
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4 **RESOLUTION 2022-500**

5 A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE PROPOSED AD VALOREM  
6 TAX MILLAGE RATES FOR THE 2022 TAX YEAR;  
7 ADVISING THE PROPERTY APPRAISER OF THE "ROLLED-  
8 BACK RATE" AND PROPOSED MILLAGE RATES FOR THE  
9 GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT, EXCEPTING URBAN  
10 SERVICES DISTRICTS 2 THROUGH 5 (THE BEACHES AND  
11 THE TOWN OF BALDWIN), FOR THE GENERAL SERVICES  
12 DISTRICT, INCLUDING ONLY URBAN SERVICES  
13 DISTRICTS 2, 3, AND 4 (THE BEACHES), AND FOR THE  
14 GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT, INCLUDING ONLY URBAN  
15 SERVICES DISTRICT 5 (THE TOWN OF BALDWIN);  
16 SETTING THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC  
17 HEARING TO CONSIDER THE PROPOSED 2022 MILLAGE  
18 RATES AND THE TENTATIVE CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT  
19 BUDGET FOR THE 2022-2023 FISCAL YEAR; REQUESTING  
20 EMERGENCY PASSAGE; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF  
21 LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO DELIVER A COPY OF THIS  
22 RESOLUTION TO THE PROPERTY APPRAISER UPON  
23 ADOPTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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25 **WHEREAS**, the Property Appraiser has certified to the Council the  
26 taxable value of real property within the City's taxing jurisdiction,  
27 which certification was provided by July 1, 2022; and

28 **WHEREAS**, Section 200.065, *Florida Statutes*, requires that the  
29 Council advise the Property Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate," of  
30 the proposed millage rate and of the date of a public hearing on the  
31 proposed rates and the tentative budget within thirty-five days of

1 the certification by the Property Appraiser; now, therefore

2 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

3 **Section 1. 2022 Rolled-back Rate Established.** Based upon  
4 the certified taxable values provided by the Property Appraiser, the  
5 Council has computed and hereby establishes that the "rolled-back  
6 rate" of millage under Section 200.065(1), *Florida Statutes*, is  
7 10.3761 mills, or \$10.3761 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for the  
8 General Services District, excepting Urban Services Districts 2  
9 through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin); is 7.3813 mills, or  
10 \$7.3813 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value, for the General Services  
11 District, including only Urban Services Districts 2, 3, and 4 (the  
12 Beaches); and is 8.8504 mills, or \$8.8504 per \$1,000 assessed taxable  
13 value, for the General Services District, including only Urban  
14 Services District 5 (the Town of Baldwin).

15 **Section 2. Proposed 2022 Millage Rates.** Based upon the  
16 certified taxable values stated in Section 1, and upon consideration  
17 of public spirited and competing community interests, the Council  
18 proposes to levy millage rates for the 2022 tax year as follows:

19 **2022 PROPOSED MILLAGE RATES**

20 **General Services District, excepting Urban Services Districts 2**  
21 **through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin)**  
22 11.3169 mills (operations), or \$11.3169 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable  
23 value;

24 **General Services District, including only Urban Services Districts**  
25 **2, 3, and 4 (the Beaches)**  
26 8.0262 mills (operations), or \$8.0262 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable  
27 value;

28 **General Services District, including only Urban Services District 5**  
29 **(the Town of Baldwin):**  
30 9.526 mills (operations), or \$9.526 per \$1,000 of assessed taxable  
31 value;

1           **Section 3.           Date, Time and Place for Public Hearing.**    The  
2 Council will hold a public hearing to consider the proposed 2022  
3 millage rates and the tentative Consolidated Government budget on  
4 September 13, 2021, at 5:01 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 1st Floor,  
5 City Hall, at 117 West Duval Street, Jacksonville, Florida.

6           **Section 4.           Requesting Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council**  
7 **Rule 4.901 Emergency.**       Emergency passage of this resolution is  
8 requested. The nature of the emergency is the requirement, pursuant  
9 to Section 200.065(2) (b), *Florida Statutes*, that the Council advise  
10 the Property Appraiser of the "rolled-back rate," of the proposed  
11 millage rates, and of the date of a public hearing on the proposed  
12 rates and tentative budget within thirty-five days of the  
13 certification by the Property Appraiser.

14           **Section 5.           Delivery to the Property Appraiser.**   The Chief  
15 of Legislative Services shall, upon approval of this Resolution,  
16 forthwith deliver a fully executed copy of this Resolution to the  
17 Duval County Property Appraiser.

18           **Section 6.           Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become  
19 effective upon signature by the Council President.
