A RESOLUTION COMMENDING DENISE DEISLER FOR HER EXEMPLARY SERVICE AS CEO OF THE JACKSONVILLE HUMANE SOCIETY, RECOGNIZING HER LEADERSHIP IN ANIMAL WELFARE, AND HONORING HER UPON HER RETIREMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Denise Deisler has served as the Chief Executive Officer of the Jacksonville Humane Society (JHS) since September 2011, bringing extensive experience in animal welfare and a passion for rescue initiatives; and

WHEREAS, prior to her tenure at JHS, Denise Deisler served as Chief Operating Officer of Richmond SPCA in Virginia from 1998 to 2007 and as the Executive Director of the Humane Society of Manatee County in Florida from 2008 to 2011, each role contributing to her extensive impact on animal welfare; and

22 WHEREAS, under her leadership, JHS implemented transformative 23 programs such as a kitten nursery and a community resource center, 24 which have significantly contributed to Jacksonville achieving and 25 maintaining a city-wide live release rate of over 90%; and

26 WHEREAS, Denise Deisler spearheaded a \$15 million campaign to 27 rebuild the JHS shelter following a devastating fire in 2007, leading 28 to the successful design and construction of a new state-of-the-art 29 44,000 square-foot facility that opened in November 2017; and

WHEREAS, Denise Deisler launched the Lifesaving University at
JHS, a pioneering program that offers training to shelter staff across

1 the country on best practices in animal welfare, significantly 2 advancing lifesaving initiatives towards a no-kill goal; and

WHEREAS, Denise Deisler has been nationally recognized for her contributions to animal welfare, including being named a Maddie's Fund Hero in 2018 and receiving the Best Friends Animal Society National Advancement Award in 2019; and

7 WHEREAS, Denise Deisler's leadership and vision have left a 8 lasting impact on the Jacksonville community improving the lives of 9 countless animals and enhancing community partnerships; and

10 WHEREAS, Denise Deisler has announced her retirement as CEO of 11 the Jacksonville Humane Society, marking the conclusion of a 12 remarkable tenure defined by dedication, compassion and 13 transformative leadership; now therefore
