A RESOLUTION HONORING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THETA PHI OF THE CHAPTER OMEGA PSI PHI FRATERNITY, INC., AND RECOGNIZING ITS CENTURY OF EXCEPTIONAL SERVICE, BROTHERHOOD, AND COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP ΙN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., was founded in 1911 at Howard University upon the cardinal principles of Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance, and Uplift-principles that continue to serve as both compass and creed for its members; and

WHEREAS, on May 11, 1925, the Theta Phi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., was chartered in the City of Jacksonville, Florida, becoming the first chapter in the State of Florida, established through the unwavering dedication of Brother W.W. Blocker and founding members Brothers W.A. Busch, G.H. Leggett, R.L. Brown, and J.A. Thomas; and

WHEREAS, the men of the Theta Phi Chapter immediately set out to make meaningful contributions to the civic, cultural, educational, and spiritual life of Jacksonville, championing the study of African American history, advocating for the inclusion of Negro achievement in public education, and uplifting the legacy of national heroes like Brother Charles Young; and

WHEREAS, the Chapter's early leadership included trailblazers such as Brother D.W. Perkins, one of Jacksonville's most esteemed attorneys and civic leaders; Brother I.E. Williams, a distinguished physician; Brother F.M. Morton, a revered educator; and Brothers J.E.

Ford and E.J. Gregg, pastoral giants who brought the ministry of Omega into the hearts of Jacksonville's faithful; and

WHEREAS, for one hundred years, the Theta Phi Chapter has stood as a beacon of excellence, fortitude, and purpose, its roster a tapestry of educators, entrepreneurs, clergy, public servants, and community advocates whose contributions have not only enriched Jacksonville but have helped elevate the broader arc of Black excellence across the South; and

WHEREAS, Theta Phi has embraced the call to service through voter engagement, scholarship endowments, social justice work, and relentless mentorship, ensuring that Omega's principles echo not just in ceremony but in practice throughout Duval County and beyond; and

WHEREAS, it is altogether fitting and proper that the City of Jacksonville salute and uplift this landmark occasion, honoring a century of "Friendship is Essential to the Soul" and a legacy of leadership forged not in comfort, but in courage; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and celebrates the 100th Anniversary of the Theta Phi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., and commends its members, past and present, for their unwavering commitment to service, leadership, and uplift in Jacksonville and the State of Florida. The Council extends heartfelt gratitude to the men of Theta Phi for a century of stewardship in shaping young minds, building stronger communities, and exemplifying the enduring power of Brotherhood.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
