Proposed ordinance's title/reference:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 121.113 (CALCULATION OF PENSION CONTRIBUTIONS FOR POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND), PART 1 (POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND ADMINISTRATION) AND SECTION 121.201 (RETIREMENT BENEFITS), PART 2 (PENSION BENEFITS), CHAPTER 121 (POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN), ORDINANCE CODE, TO CLARIFY THE TERM "SALARY" AND THE CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE WHILE MEMBERS ARE ON MILITARY LEAVE OF ABSENCE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public

Section 116.501 of the Ordinance Code sets forth various benefits for employees who are on military leaves of absence. This Ordinance is intended to clarify the term "salary" and the contribution payable within the Police and Firefighters Pension Plan while members are on military leave of absence.
