Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office, explained the amendment. Approved unanimously.

Council Member Gay talked about the impetus for the bill and the uniqueness of the NE Jax area. Charles Barr, North CPAC, spoke on his own behalf in support of the bill.

Mr. James, Planning Director, explained the Planning Department's opposition to the bill. Council Member Johnson suggested collaborating with the Planning Commission to identify improvements or needed changes. Council Member Freeman cautioned about precedent and opening "pandora's box". The committee deferred this item since it was deferred in NCSPHS, and to allow more time to workshop the bill.

Council Member Miller talked about preserving the freedom of speech. Council Member Freeman said that prohibitions against signs already exist.

Council Member Boylan offered a floor amendment to remove the proposed changes to Council Rule 4.505(1), seconded by CM Miller. Approved 5-1 (CM Carlucci in opposition)

Ms. Staffopoulos, OGC, held different size signs for reference prior to the discussion about sign size. Council Member Boylan offered a second floor amendment to approve signs up to 3x3 sq.ft. in size. Approved 5-2 (CMs Gay and Freeman in opposition)

Council Member Carlucci said he is opposed to infringing on 1st Amendment rights, he noted that the Council President has the authority to deal with problem situations by using good judgment.

Council Member Freeman reluctantly opposed because of potential unintended consequences. Ms. Staffopoulos said if signs aren't displayed or waved in the Chamber then they are not in violation of the current rule. Council Member Freeman asked if there is a way for viewers at home to submit information for display; he thought there had been discussion of that in the past. Ms. Lahmeur said that was in conjunction with a speaker registration system and that didn't go forward. Council Member Johnson said no one wants to infringe on free speech, only enforce rules of decorum for good order. Council Member Boylan said the amendment provides more opportunity for the public to get their

message across by allowing signs that are currently not allowed. Council Member Carlucci said CP White asked the Rules Committee to examine the issue and use its best judgment. CP White indicated that he will probably accept whatever is recommended by the committee.

Council Member Howland said there are lots of ways to get to 3 sq. ft. – would it be better to adopt a template size and require that? Ms. Staffopoulos said that makes good sense. She noted that wearing a T-shirt that exceeds those dimensions would violate the prohibition.

Council Member Boylan amended floor amendment to state that sign size must be no larger than 21x21 inches (replacing 3 sq. ft.) – approved 5-2 (Freeman and Gay) Rolled-up amendment approved 5-2.

Trista Carraher, Auditor's Office explained the amendment, which was approved unanimously via a voice vote.

Council Member Howland said the budget for the SalesForce project continues growing from \$1M to over \$2.3M due to expansions of the project scope and wants to know where the cost savings from efficiency will come from. The funds are from the Mayor's transition task force \$25M allocation and excess funds there should have been used for other projects.

Wanyonyi Kendrick, Technology Solutions, said IT's budget is lower than in previous years and they have saved \$6.2M in the 15 months they've been in office. She asked that the bill be withdrawn and the \$200,000 can go towards other uses as they have found savings elsewhere to pay for SalesForce.

Ms. Staffopoulos said that Mr. Teal and Ms. Busby can work on the details of the proposed changes. Council Member Peluso said the bond is too low for large projects, he recommended a deferral or withdrawal.

Council Member Gay shared some photos of road damage after work in a right-of-way. Ms. Busby requested the date of the photos.

Council Member Salem asked for a chart at the next meeting that depicts the proposed changes to the bill, and he recommended that the TeleCom partners attend. Ms. Staffopoulos said she will create such a chart.

Council Member Miller asked about restoration oversight and warranties after right-of-way work is completed. Mr. Peterson said the City provides a 1 year warranty for road work projects.
