A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF DR.  
LANTIE ELISABETH JORANDBY, AS A MEMBER OF THE  
OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER GRANTS  
COMMITTEE, AS A HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL  
REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 84.202  
(COMPOSITION; CITY COUNCIL LIAISON; TERMS;  
REMOVAL), PART 2 (OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE  
DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE), CHAPTER 84 (OPIOID  
SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), *ORDINANCE CODE*, FOR  
A SECOND FULL TERM ENDING ON JUNE 30, 2028;  
ESTABLISHING SUBSTANTIAL BUSINESS INTEREST IN  
DUVAL COUNTY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 50.102(B)  
(RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT) (MEMBERS OF BOARDS AND  
COMMISSIONS), PART 1 (ORGANIZATION), CHAPTER 50  
(ORGANIZATION OF BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS),  
*ORDINANCE CODE*; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

**Section 1. Reappointment.** The Council hereby confirms the  
Mayor's reappointment of Dr. Lantie Elisabeth Jorandby to the Opioid  
and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee, as a Healthcare  
Professional representative, in accordance with Section 84.202  
(Composition; City Council Liaison; Terms; Removal), Part 2 (Opioid  
and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee), Chapter 84 (Opioid  
Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*, for a second full term

expiring on June 30, 2028.

**Section 2. A Non-Resident of Duval County with substantial economic business interests in Duval County.** Section 50.102 (Members of Boards and Commissions), Part 1 (Organization), Chapter 50 (Organization of Boards and Commissions), *Ordinance Code*, requires Board and Commission members be either a Duval County resident or individuals with substantial economic business interest or substantial philanthropic interest as determined by the City Council in Duval County. Dr. Jorandby has substantial business interests in Duval County as she will serve as the Chief Medical Officer at a new mental health and substance use disorder clinic that will be located in Duval County and opening this summer.

**Section 3. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
