## ORDINANCE 2020-179-E

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; APPROPRIATING \$1,401,975.00 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY, WITH NO CITY MATCH, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019 REGIONAL CATASTROPHIC PREPAREDNESS GRANT PROGRAM ("RCPGP") TO FUND TWO FULL-TIME PROGRAM MANAGERS, TRAINING CLASSES, EXERCISE WORKSHOPS, AND THE PURCHASE OF NON-CAPITAL OFFICE SUPPLIES AND OPERATING SUPPLIES, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 20-053; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO ACCEPT, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE RCPGP AWARD DOCUMENTS BETWEEN THE U. S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND THE JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING FOR CITY CITY OF OVERSIGHT BY THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; APPROVING POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 20-093; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

## (c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above is a grant award from the U. S. Department of Homeland Security, with no local match, for the Fiscal Year 2019 Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program ("RCPGP") to fund two full-time program managers, training classes, exercise workshops, and the purchase of non-capital office supplies and operating supplies. The assistance arrangement for this program is on a Cost Reimbursement basis.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the RCPGP is to build state and local capacity to manage catastrophic incidents by improving and expanding regional collaboration for catastrophic incident preparedness. The FY 2019 RCPGP requires grant recipients to develop and deliver one project that builds capability to address a gap in the Logistics and Supply Chain Management core capability. The City submitted a proposal to fund a three-year project titled "Regional Logistics and Supply Chain Management (RLSCM) Resilience Initiative Project (the "Project"). The Project will identify systemic regional vulnerabilities interdependencies and facilitate development of plans and mitigation strategies to fortify the regional logistic supply chain. In addition, the Project will provide a significant investment in human capital within the region by providing skills and training and enabling certifications that support the core

capability of Logistics and Supply Chain Management. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for two full-time RCPGP managers through September 30, 2022, contractual costs for course delivery of 12 FEMA courses, contractual costs for exercise design and development, fringe and travel costs for the salaried employees, and the purchase of non-capital office supplies and operating supplies. The grant period is from October 1, 2019, through September 30, 2022.

Section 3. Approval and authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to accept, for and on behalf of the City, the RCPGP Award Documents between the U. S. Department of Homeland Security and City of Jacksonville, in substantially the same form placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 4. Oversight. The City of Jacksonville Emergency Preparedness Division will provide oversight.

Section 5. Approval of Positions. There are hereby approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 20-093, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 6. Requesting emergency passage pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage of this legislation is requested. This ordinance was introduced at the March 10, 2020 Council meeting, however, due to the state of emergency as a result of COVID-19, the referenced Committees were unable to meet to address this bill, therefore, the request for emergency action is being done so that if can be taken up at the Special Council meeting. The nature of the emergency is that Jacksonville is one of only eight cities in the nation to receive this resilience grant, which is an opportunity for Jacksonville to address current supply chain gaps. As soon as the grant is made available, it can help

the Emergency Operations Center immediately implement logistical support for COVID-19. Because this resilience grant specifically addresses supply chain gaps for Jacksonville, the City can immediately begin foresting access to personal protective equipment (PPE) during this worldwide shortage, due to COVID-19. The grant provides help for the EOC by bringing on staff that can specifically address those and other gaps as the City continues with the response to COVID-19. Because of the response to COVID-19, and delays at the Federal level, Jacksonville is already months into the three-year period of performance for the grant. This means that Jacksonville can still meet the deliverables for the grant but Jacksonville must begin as soon as possible.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
