5 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING JACQUELYN H. "JACKIE"
6 CORNELIUS FOR HER LEADERSHIP AND ENDURING IMPACT
7 ON ARTS EDUCATION IN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AS
8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEVELOPING ARTISTS
9 FOUNDATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 **WHEREAS**, Jacquelyn H. "Jackie" Cornelius, a Jacksonville native
12 and graduate of Duval County Public Schools, earned a bachelor's
13 degree from the University of Florida, and Master's degree in
14 Educational Leadership from the University of North Florida; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Ms. Cornelius was an invaluable asset to the Duval
16 County Public Schools for 47 years, including her service as the
17 principal of Douglas Anderson School of the Arts for 20 years, where
18 under her leadership and guidance, Douglas Anderson School of the
19 Arts was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence,
20 a National Model School, and a National Leader School by the US
21 Department of Education, as well as being listed by Newsweek magazine
22 as one of the Best Academic High Schools in the country; and

23 **WHEREAS**, Jackie Cornelius, a humanitarian dedicated to
24 supporting projects and opportunities that primarily benefit
25 students, schools, faculty and staff, retired from Duval County Public
26 Schools in 2017, has continued to distinguish herself as a dedicated
27 arts advocate and community leader in Jacksonville, helping expand
28 opportunities for young artists and strengthening arts education
29 throughout the region; and

30 **WHEREAS**, under her leadership as Executive Director, the
31 Developing Artists Foundation, a non-profit organization established

1 in 1987, has worked to support arts education and professional
2 development opportunities for students, particularly those attending
3 Douglas Anderson School of the Arts; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the Developing Artists Foundation advances its mission
5 by providing resources that enhance arts education, including funding
6 for visiting professional artists, artist-in-residence programs, arts
7 teacher fellowships, specialized equipment, and student scholarships,
8 ensuring that students receive high-quality training and exposure to
9 professional artistic practice; and

10 **WHEREAS**, through the Foundation's DuBow Summer Arts Scholarship
11 Program, students can attend competitive summer arts intensives and
12 conservatory programs across the United States and internationally,
13 gaining advanced training and mentorship opportunities; and

14 **WHEREAS**, in 2024, the Developing Artists Foundation awarded
15 \$52,000 in scholarships to nine students from Douglas Anderson School
16 of the Arts, enabling those students to participate in prestigious
17 summer arts programs and further develop their artistic talents; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the Foundation also played an important role in
19 expanding the arts infrastructure at Douglas Anderson School of the
20 Arts, including philanthropic support that made possible the Betsy
21 Lovett Amphitheatre, a \$1.18 million outdoor performance venue that
22 provides students with a professional space for performances,
23 showcases, and community events; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the impact of the Foundation's work is further
25 reflected in the accomplishments of Douglas Anderson's students,
26 including the Class of 2024 receiving more than \$28 million in college
27 scholarship offers, with many graduates pursuing higher education in
28 the arts and creative industries; and

29 **WHEREAS**, through leadership, advocacy, and philanthropic
30 engagement as Executive Director, Jackie Cornelius has played a vital
31 role in supporting efforts to expand educational opportunities for

1 students and bolster the city's cultural community; now therefore

2 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

3 **Section 1.** The City Council hereby commends Jacquelyn H.
4 "Jackie" Cornelius for her outstanding leadership, dedication, and
5 continued service to students and the arts in Jacksonville through
6 her work as Executive Director of the Developing Artists Foundation.

7 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
8 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
9 without the Mayor's signature.
