7 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 121.105  
8 (PENSIONER'S RIGHTS UPON REEMPLOYMENT BY CITY),  
9 PART 1 (POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND  
10 ADMINISTRATION), CHAPTER 121 (POLICE AND  
11 FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN), *ORDINANCE CODE*, TO  
12 PROVIDE THAT SWORN CIVIL PROCESS SERVER AND  
13 SHERIFF'S LIAISON OFFICER RETIREES SHALL BE  
14 EXEMPT FROM CERTAIN PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO  
15 REEMPLOYMENT; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH  
16 SECTION 121.104 (REVIEW OF PROPOSED  
17 LEGISLATION), *ORDINANCE CODE*, PERTAINING TO  
18 REVIEW AND COMMENT FROM THE POLICE AND FIRE  
19 PENSION FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES, COMPLETION OF AN  
20 ACTUARIAL REPORT, AND REQUEST FOR  
21 RECOMMENDATIONS AND COMMENT FROM THE STATE  
22 DIVISION OF RETIREMENT; PROVIDING FOR  
23 CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN  
24 EFFECTIVE DATE.

26 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

27 **Section 1. Amending Section 121.105 (Pensioner's rights**  
28 **upon reemployment by City), Part 1 (Police and Fire Pension Fund**  
29 **Administration), Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters Pension Plan),**  
30 **Ordinance Code.** Section 121.105 (Pensioner's rights upon  
31 reemployment by City), Part 1 (Police and Fire Pension Fund

Administration), Chapter 121 (Police and Firefighters Pension Plan),  
Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

**CHAPTER 121 - POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS PENSION PLAN**

**PART 1. - POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUND ADMINISTRATION**

**Sec. 121.105. - Pensioner's rights upon reemployment by City.**

\* \* \*

(d) The provisions of subsections (a) through (c) shall not apply to any retiree of the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Fund employed in a full-time, part-time, or temporary capacity by the City or any of its officers as (i) court bailiff, (ii) logistical and technical support officer, (iii) corrections bond custodian, (iv) chaplain, (v) stable manager, (vi) corrections mail coordinator, (vii) aviation supervisor, (viii) court bailiff supervisor, (ix) Community Projects inmates work crew supervisor, (x) investigator for the Office of General Counsel, (xi) Mayoral protective officer, ~~or~~ (xii) City Council protective officer, (xiii) sworn civil process server, or (xiv) Sheriff's liaison officer. Being employed in one of the positions identified in this subsection (d) shall not prevent a retiree of this plan from continuing to receive such retirement benefits as would be available had the retiree not begun employment in one of the previously-mentioned positions. Being employed in one of the positions identified in this subsection (d) shall not permit or require a retiree of this plan to be a member of the pension plan created pursuant to this Chapter 121 or a member of one of the pension plans created by Part II or III of Chapter 120. Being employed in one of the positions identified in this subsection (d) shall not permit a retiree to acquire any time-service credit in the pension plan created

1           pursuant to this Chapter 121 or in any one of the pension  
2           plans created by Part II or III of Chapter 120.

4           **Section 2.           Providing for Compliance With Section 121.104,**  
5 **Ordinance Code.** Pursuant to Section 121.104 (Review of proposed  
6 legislation), *Ordinance Code*, this Ordinance will be presented to the  
7 Police and Fire Pension Fund Board of Trustees for review and comment.  
8 Additionally, an actuarial report, as required by Section 121.104,  
9 *Ordinance Code*, will be completed and recommendations and comments  
10 will be requested from the State Division of Retirement to accompany  
11 this legislation prior to final action by the City Council. The  
12 aforementioned actuarial report was requested and is attached hereto  
13 as **Exhibit 1.**

14           **Section 3.           Codification Instructions.** The Codifier and the  
15 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and  
16 division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth  
17 herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the  
18 Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are  
19 approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance Code  
20 shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

21           **Section 4.           Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become  
22 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
23 without the Mayor's signature.
