WHEREAS, Paris Richardson, a proud Jacksonville native and alumna of Jean Ribault High School (Class of 2020), has made our community proud by being crowned Miss Florida 2025, the first Miss Gainesville winner since 1952 - a monumental achievement that places her among the elite in pageant history; and
