8 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT; 9 APPROPRIATING \$602,328.00 IN ANNUAL EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT ("ESG") FUNDING FROM THE U.S. 10 DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT TO 11 FUND VARIOUS SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES AIMED AT 12 13 ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS AND THAT MEET THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE ESG PROGRAM, AS INITIATED 14 15 BY REVISED B.T. 26-002; INVOKING THE EXEMPTION 16 ΤN SECTION 126.108(G) (EXEMPTIONS FROM COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION), PART 1 (GENERAL 17 18 REGULATIONS; ETHICS AND TRANSPARENCY IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING), CHAPTER 126, (PROCUREMENT CODE), 19 20 ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT CONTRACT 21 WITH CHANGING HOMELESSNESS, INC.; WAIVING 22 SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING 23 THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY 24 25 GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW FOR A DIRECT 26 CONTRACT WITH CHANGING HOMELESSNESS, INC.; 27 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY 28 ТΟ EXECUTE AND DELIVER ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AN 29 30 EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CHANGING HOMELESSNESS, INC. FOR THE PROVISION OF 31

SERVICES DESCRIBED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR THE MAYOR AND CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE AWARD; PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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8 BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
9 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2025-2026 fiscal year,
10 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
11 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
12 listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$602,328.00 in annual grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for the Emergency Solutions Grant ("ESG") program. The City is required to match ESG funds with an equal amount of cash and/or non-cash contributions, which may include donated buildings, materials, and volunteer services. The City accomplishes this match requirement through programs and funding provided by the Social Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department. The ESG program grant funds must be expended within 24 months after HUD signs the grant

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agreement.

2 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for services and activities aimed at 3 addressing homelessness and that meet ESG program goals and 4 objectives. This includes activities and services that: (i) engage 5 homeless individuals and families living on the street; (ii) improve 6 7 the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals and families; (iii) help operate these shelters; (iv) provide 8 9 essential services to shelter residents; (v) rapidly re-house 10 homeless individuals and families; and (vi) prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless. A portion of the ESG funds will be 11 used for costs associated with administration of the ESG program. 12 The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of ESG 13 funds is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised 14 Exhibit 2, Rev Sched, June 16, 2025 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein 15 by this reference. A copy of the grant award letter from HUD is 16 attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this 17 18 reference.

Invoking the exception to Section 126.108(g), 19 Section 3. 20 Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of 21 the professional services of Changing Homelessness, Inc. for administration and oversight of the Homeless Management Information 22 System for the ESG program. Pursuant to Section 126.108(g) 23 24 (Exemptions from competitive solicitation), Part 1 (General 25 Regulations; Ethics and Transparency in Public Contracting), Chapter 26 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are 27 28 to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing 29 legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall 30 remain in full force and effect. 31

Waiver of Section 118.107, Ordinance Code. 1 Section 4. The 2 provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), 3 Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow 4 5 for a direct contract with Changing Homelessness, Inc. This waiver is justified because Changing Homelessness, Inc. is the only entity 6 7 able to provide administration and oversight of the Homeless 8 Management Information System which is crucial to the program's 9 continued success.

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Section 5. Approval and Authorization to 11 Execute an Emergency Solutions Grant Agreement Between the City and Changing 12 13 Homelessness, Inc. The Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on 14 15 behalf of the City, an Emergency Solutions Grant Agreement with Changing Homelessness, Inc. (the "Agreement") in an amount not to 16 17 exceed \$50,000.00, in a form approved by the Office General Counsel and the City's Risk Management Division, and all other contracts and 18 19 documents, including extensions, renewals and amendments to the 20 Agreement, and otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the 21 intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office General Counsel and the City's Risk Management 22 Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements 23 in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code. 24

25 Section 6. Execution of Documents. The Mayor, or her 26 designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to 27 execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to effectuate the 28 purpose set forth in Section 2 above.

Section 7. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds.
In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an
award of ESG funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible

awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the
 Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission for award
 of ESG funds.

4 Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
5 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
6 without the Mayor's signature.
