6 A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE
7 LIFE AND WORKS OF LONG-TIME CHURCH MUSICIAN
8 AND PILLAR OF THE COMMUNITY SYNTHIA HARTLEY
9 MCFATTEN FOR 48 YEARS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE;
10 PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

12 **WHEREAS**, Synthia Hartley McFatten was born on July 27th, 1941
13 in Ocala, Florida to her parents Alexander Hartley and Lillie Mae
14 Fields. Ms. Hartley had a strong Christian upbringing with her
15 three younger brothers: Alexander Jr., James Alex, and Henry
16 Michael. Following her graduation from Howard High School in Ocala,
17 Ms. Hartley married Levi McFatten and relocated to Jacksonville.
18 Mrs. McFatten continued her education attending Florida Junior
19 College and received an Associate of Arts degree; and

20 **WHEREAS**, following in the footsteps of her father, Alexander,
21 who was a talented musician, Mrs. McFatten has excelled as a
22 singer, pianist, and musician sharing her talents with many
23 churches and choirs in Ocala and Jacksonville, including St. Paul
24 African Methodist Episcopal Church, Magnolia Missionary Baptist
25 Church, Triumph The Church and Kingdom of God In Christ, Mount
26 Herman Missionary Baptist Church, St. Mary's Missionary Baptist
27 Church, Beulah Missionary Baptist Church, Mount Nebo Baptist
28 Church, and most notably at her beloved home church Friendship
29 Missionary Baptist where she served as a church musician for over
30 48 years; and

31 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. McFatten has served in many roles and capacities

1 within the church, including church musician, assistant youth
2 director, vacation bible school teacher, Sunday school teacher, a
3 member of the Willing Workers Club, and the founder of the Senior
4 Ministry where she currently serves as President. Additionally,
5 Mrs. McFatten dedicated herself to engaging the youth of her
6 community by starting the first 4-H club on the Northside of
7 Jacksonville, the Sherwood Harborview 4-H Club. Mrs. McFatten also
8 gave piano lessons in her home to over 200 students and held annual
9 recitals to exhibit and encourage their talents; and

10 **WHEREAS,** professionally, Mrs. McFatten worked as an
11 underwriter for the Prudential Insurance Company. After her
12 retirement, Mrs. McFatten went to work at Independent Living
13 Services and later at Northeast Florida ElderSource helping senior
14 citizens of Jacksonville in multiple capacities. Additionally, Mrs.
15 McFatten was a supervisor for the SHINE Program (Serving Health
16 Insurance Needs of the Elderly). Mrs. McFatten is the mother of
17 three daughters Sytoya, Shajuana, and Ana'Latore and the proud
18 grandmother of five; now therefore

19 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

20 **Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and
21 commemorates the life and works of Synthia Hartley McFatten for her
22 48 years of community service, her commitment to the youth of the
23 Northside Jacksonville community and her work with the elderly, and
24 wishes her many more years of happiness and service to her church
25 and community.

26 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become
27 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
28 without the Mayor's signature.
