A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING PETER RACINE FOR HIS MANY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AS SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT OF THE JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS FOUNDATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Peter Racine, a Connecticut native raised in New Jersey, earned a bachelor's degree at Rutgers University and his Master of Theological Studies at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago; and

whereas, Mr. Racine began his long and varied career in social services working for approximately 12 years with runaways, homeless youth and urban street youth at Covenant House, starting in New York; he and his wife, Kelly, then started Covenant House's programs for street children in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, and helped to start programs in Toronto and Houston. Upon returning to the states, he was hired to start the Northeast Florida Exchange Club Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse, which served families in Jacksonville and Clay County; and

WHEREAS, Peter Racine has been a partner in various national and international initiatives, including the Community Partnership for Protecting Children, the Early Childhood Violence Prevention Project, Outreach to Urban Street Children, the Sports Philanthropy Project, and Jacksonville's EPIC neighborhood revitalization initiative; and

WHEREAS, Peter Racine and his wife established the Center for Central American Empowerment, whose mission is to support, protect and empower women and girls, strengthen families and promote male responsibility, working the nations of Honduras, Guatemala and Nicaragua; his outstanding work protecting and advocating for youth was featured in media venues such as Dateline NBC and in Time magazine; and

WHEREAS, in September 2000, Mr. Racine joined the Jacksonville Jaguars Foundation (the "Foundation") as Director of Programs, became Executive Director in 2001 and was promoted to President in 2011. As the philanthropic arm of the Jacksonville Jaguars NFL franchise, the Foundation provides grants and assistance to uplift the community by providing economic and equal opportunity through programs that strengthen our neighborhoods and develop our youth, building a better Jacksonville together; and

WHEREAS, for more than 20 years Peter Racine has guided the important work of the Foundation in making an investment of millions of dollars in the future of Jacksonville, particularly in its youth, and has helped to transform our community for the better; and

WHEREAS, Peter Racine fostered a partnership between the Jaguars and the leadership of the Military Affairs and Veterans Department to create the Jacksonville Veterans Resource and Reintegration Center, which developed a model for wrap-around services for veterans and military families in City Hall; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Racine has recently announced his retirement from the Jaguars organization; his lifetime of work on behalf of the disadvantaged, the vulnerable, and the community, as a whole, deserves commendation; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends

Peter Racine for his many contributions to the Jacksonville community

on the occasion of his retirement as Senior Vice President of the Jacksonville Jaguars Foundation, thanks him for his long career of service to humankind and extends its best wishes for future health and happiness in the next phase of his life.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
