ORDINANCE 2025-324

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,100,000 FROM THE TREE PROTECTION AND RELATED EXPENSES TRUST FUND - CONTRIBUTIONS FROM PRIVATE SOURCES ACCOUNT TO THE COUNTY-WIDE TREE PROG-REMOVE-REPLACE - TRUST FUND AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES ACCOUNT FOR REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT OF DEAD/DYING OR HAZARDOUS TREES ON PUBLIC PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER; PROVIDING FOR CONTINUED OVERSIGHT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Tree Commission was established by Ordinance 2017-397-E, as described in Chapter 94, Ordinance Code, which outlines the various duties and responsibilities of the Tree Commission to develop and maintain a healthy tree canopy in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City currently maintains two Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Funds; the first was created pursuant to Section 25.04 of the *Jacksonville City Charter* and the second by Ordinance which is codified in Section 111.760, Ordinance Code; and

WHEREAS, while these Funds are subject to different guidelines and requirements, both serve the fundamental mission of planting and maintaining trees along the public rights-of-way and on public lands within the City, so as to mitigate for the loss or destruction of protected trees and to replace the tree canopy in the City that has been lost through the process of land development; and

WHEREAS, the County-Wide Tree Planting Program - Right of Way (also known as the "Remove and Replace Program") was initiated by

Ordinance 2018-775-E to authorize the Department of Public Works to remove trees within the public rights-of-way and public parks of the City that are damaged, dead, in impending decline, or that have become a hazard to the public health, safety and welfare, and to replace such trees within certain established guidelines; and

WHEREAS, during a special meeting on April 28, 2025, the Tree Commission voted to recommend appropriating funds to the Remove and Replace Program in the total amount of \$2,100,000 from the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund established by Ordinance in Chapter 111, Ordinance Code; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsections (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of the Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$2,100,000 from the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund - Contributions from Private Sources account to the County-Wide Tree Prog-Remove-Replace - Trust Fund Authorized Expenditures account (the "Remove and Replace Program" or "Program") to provide funding for removal and replacement of diseased, deceased and declining trees within the City's rights-of-way and parks.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in

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Section 1 is to provide funding for the City's Remove and Replace Program wherein the Department of Public Works removes and replaces trees within the City's public rights-of-way and parks that are damaged, dead, in impending decline, or a hazard to the public health, safety and welfare. As part of its administration of the Program, the Department of Public Works shall ensure that any trees that are planted or removed are recorded electronically on Plan-it Geo, or its equivalent, and shall note the species and size of each, as well as the date of planting or removal.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover to subsequent fiscal years until expended.

Section 4. Oversight Department. The Public Works

Department shall continue to oversee and administer the Program described herein.

Section 5. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that funding for the Remove and Replace Program is nearly depleted, and there is a desire for the City Council to act upon the request for the appropriation of funds as soon as possible.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
