RESOLUTION 2025-570-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING LLOYD WASHINGTON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DURKEEVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY, FOR HIS OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE PRESERVATION AND CELEBRATION OF JACKSONVILLE'S AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY AND HERITAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Jacksonville wishes to recognize individuals who have made significant and lasting contributions to the cultural, historical, and educational enrichment of our city; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lloyd Washington has served as President of the Durkeeville Historical Society since 2011, joining the organization in 2008, and has dedicated himself to preserving the legacy of Jacksonville's historically Black neighborhoods, including Durkeeville and LaVilla; and

WHEREAS, under Mr. Washington's leadership, the Durkeeville Historical Society has grown into a respected cultural institution, curating historical exhibits, leading educational tours, and engaging in public history initiatives that have informed, inspired, and empowered residents of all backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington's work was instrumental in securing historic designation for the Durkeeville neighborhood in 2022, formally recognizing it as Jacksonville's first historically African American neighborhood, and ensuring its cultural and architectural

legacy is protected for future generations; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington played a pivotal role in the creation of Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing Park, a cultural landmark located near the childhood home of James Weldon Johnson and John Rosamond Johnson, where he advocated for more than 17 years to see the project come to fruition, ultimately dedicating the park with historical markers and a vision for public art and civic memory; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington has been a tireless advocate for the preservation and revitalization of J.P. Small Memorial Stadium, a historic Negro Leagues ballpark in Durkeeville, helping secure \$500,000 in state funding in 2018 and supporting ongoing renovations including an expanded museum exhibit titled "The Legend of Black Baseball," preserving the legacies of Hank Aaron, the Jacksonville Red Caps, and many others; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his work with the Durkeeville Historical Society, Mr. Washington served as President of the Grand Park Community Association for 16 years, where he advocated for infrastructure improvements, public safety, and neighborhood revitalization in Northwest Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington has held numerous civic leadership roles, including serving on the Board of Directors of the Jacksonville Housing Partnership, the Weed and Seed program, the Northwest Jacksonville Community Development Council, and the Jacksonville City Council Task Force on Civil Rights History; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Washington has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to community engagement, historical preservation, and public education, working tirelessly to ensure that the achievements, struggles, and contributions of African Americans in Jacksonville are remembered and honored; and

WHEREAS, his efforts have not only enhanced the cultural fabric of Jacksonville but also helped foster a greater understanding and

appreciation for the city's diverse heritage; and
