Council Member Carlucci explained the bill and the intent to protect the integrity of neighborhood character. He offered a floor amendment to require a 2/3 vote of council members present to create a new zoning overlay, and require a 2/3 vote of council members present to waive the prohibition on PUDs within overlays. Approved with 4-1 vote, CM Salem in opposition

Council Member Salem expressed his concern that the 2/3 vote threshold is overused.

Council Member Clark-Murray asked questions about the criteria for 2/3 approval voting. Mary Staffopoulos, OGC, explained that the vote requirements are spelled out in the Ordinance Code, Council Rules and/or Charter.

Council Member Miller asked about the age of the overlays and whether they are updated regularly.

Council Member Amaro spoke about the 2/3 vote being a guard rail to protect the overlays.

Council Member Clark-Murray indicated that the threshold should be higher to create or deviate from an overlay.

Council Member Salem said he has not heard from any constituents on this bill.

Council Member Gay shared his support for the bill and mentioned that he wished the overlay in his district had been created sooner.

This item did not receive 4 votes in either direction and as such was deferred.

Phillip Peterson explained the amendment. Approved unanimously.

Bill Clement, JSO, explained the bill.

Jake Gordon, DVI, explained the Homeward Bound program which provides transportation support for some of the unhoused population who wish to return to their hometown or town where family is located. The program is under the purview of JSO and administered by DVI on a reimbursement basis. Mr. Gordon said roughly 250 people utilized the program last year, with 605 assisted since 2020. Council Member Salem shared his support for the program and asked how many people decline the service. Mr. Gordon said that they frequently receive requests for program services. He also emphasized that the program encompasses more than just a free bus ticket, but also involves connecting with the family members in advance and connection to other resources as needed. Council Member Amaro asked whether those who return "home" through the program stay there or return to Jacksonville. Mr. Gordon said that no individual has used the program twice.

Council Member Miller shared his support for the program.

Council Member J. Carlucci asked whether city of origin is asked during the Point in Time Count.

Mr. Clement requested a floor amendment to add an appropriation of \$137,000 for the Homeward Bound program to the bill.
