Greer Gillis, Jacksonville Transportation Authority, gave a presentation updating the council on JTA's MobilityWorks road project status report. Ms. Gillis said that JTA is focused on transparency and having a dashboard available to follow the development of projects. CM Morgan stressed the importance of projects having a clear timeline.
