22 GRANT CYCLE TO BE THROUGH DECEMBER 18, 2023;
23 REQUESTING ONE-CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE;
24 PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS;
25 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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27 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

28 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2023-2024 fiscal year,
29 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated
30 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
31 listed in subsection (b):

7 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

8 The funding above is an appropriation from the Opioid
9 Settlement Fund - Miscellaneous Settlements account to the
10 Opioid Settlement Fund - Subsidies and Contributions to
11 Private Organizations account to fund Opioid Settlement
12 Proceeds Grants for Fiscal Year 2023-2024.

13 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
14 Section 1 is to provide additional funding for Opioid Settlement
15 Proceeds Grants to be awarded to qualified requesting agencies in
16 Fiscal Year 2023-2024 in accordance with Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement
17 Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*. This funding comprises 70 percent
18 of the total opioid settlement proceeds deposited in the Opioid
19 Settlement Special Revenue Fund created by Section 111.265, *Ordinance*
20 *Code*, as of July 1, 2023.

21 **Section 3. Amending Sections 84.301 (Opioid Settlement**
22 **Proceeds Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants) and 84.307**
23 **(Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant Award**
24 **Limitations), Part 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), Chapter 84**
25 **(Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*.** Sections 84.301
26 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Allocation for Opioid Settlement Proceeds
27 Grants) and 84.307 (Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee;
28 Grant Award Limitations), Part 3 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants),
29 Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), *Ordinance Code*, are
30 amended to read as follows:

31 **CHAPTER 84 - OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS**

2 **PART 3. - OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS**

3 **Sec. 84.301. - Opioid Settlement Proceeds Allocation for Opioid**
4 **Settlement Proceeds Grants.**

5 The City of Jacksonville shall make an initial appropriation to
6 the OSUD Grants Committee in an amount equal to 40 percent of total
7 Opioid Settlement Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special
8 Revenue Fund created by Section 111.265, *Ordinance Code*, as of July
9 1, 2023. Thereafter, on or before April 1 of each year, the Finance
10 and Administration Department shall calculate the total Opioid
11 Settlement Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special
12 Revenue Fund during the immediately preceding calendar year. The
13 annual funding amount for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants shall,
14 at a minimum, be equal to ~~40~~ 70 percent of the total Opioid Settlement
15 Proceeds deposited in the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund
16 during the immediately preceding calendar year. This appropriation
17 shall be included in the Mayor's proposed annual budget for the
18 upcoming fiscal year. The Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants
19 Committee shall not award or allocate funding to requesting agencies
20 under this Chapter until after the City Council has approved the
21 annual budget ordinance. Any Opioid Settlement Proceeds appropriated
22 to the OSUD Grants Committee for Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants
23 that are not awarded or that remain unencumbered at the end of a
24 fiscal year shall not be returned to the Opioid Settlement Special
25 Revenue Fund but shall carry forward to the next fiscal year for
26 subsequent award by the OSUD Grants Committee. The City appropriation
27 for the next fiscal year shall not be reduced by the amount of any
28 unencumbered or unawarded residual funds from prior fiscal years.

30 **Sec. 84.307. - Funding Allocations by OSUD Grants Committee; Grant**
31 **Award Limitations.**

1 (a) *Limitations on Grant Awards.* Individual grants within each
2 Opioid Settlement Proceeds funded category shall be based on the
3 high score model for funding purposes. The high score model
4 shall award 100 percent of requested funding for the highest-
5 ranked score up to the maximum amount of ~~\$250,000~~ \$500,000. The
6 next highest-ranked score shall be awarded 100 percent of the
7 requested funding up to ~~\$250,000~~ \$500,000 and so on until the
8 funds are exhausted.

10 **Section 4. Grant Application Deadline for Fiscal Year 2023-**
11 **2024 Grant Cycle.** Requesting agencies shall have through December
12 18, 2023, to submit a grant application for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024
13 grant cycle.

14 **Section 5. Requesting One-cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant**
15 **to Council Rule 4.901 (Declaration of Emergency), Part 9 (Emergency**
16 **Legislation), Chapter 4 (Procedures).** One-cycle emergency passage
17 of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that
18 the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee is currently
19 in the process of receiving grant application submittals for Fiscal
20 Year 2023-2024 and need to notify requesting agencies of the increased
21 award limitation amount and the additional grant funds provided
22 herein.

23 **Section 6. Codification Instructions.** The Codifier and the
24 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and
25 division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth
26 herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the
27 *Ordinance Code* consistent with the intent of this legislation are
28 approved and directed herein, and changes to the *Ordinance Code* shall
29 be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

30 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
31 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

1 without the Mayor's signature.
