This legislation is to authorize federal funding to acquire and demolish a residential structure at 4651 Ken Knight Drive North, Jacksonville, Florida 32209; funded through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) DR-4673-003-R, as approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

The Sub-Recipient, City of Jacksonville, agrees to administer and complete the project per the scope of work as submitted by the Sub-Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA. The Sub- Recipient shall complete the work in accordance with Federal, State and Local Laws, Regulations and Codes.

As a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project, the Sub-Recipient proposes absolute flood protection to the property located at 4651 Ken Knight Drive North, Jacksonville, Florida 32209. Coordinates (30.391799, -81.718302).

The scope of work for this project is to acquire and demolish the property to prevent any reoccurring flood losses. Debris and slab removal will follow demolition. The property will be converted to green space and deed restricted in perpetuity, in accordance with FEMA Program requirements pursuant to 44 CFR 206.434 (e).

The subject property sits on the street adjacent of the Ribault River. This property has suffered major losses over time that have adversely affected the occupants. The property is not insured for flood loss but the total valuation of losses would likely exceed the current value of the property if it were insured.

The mitigation grant agreement shall be entered into by the State of Florida. Division of Emergency Management, with headquarters in Tallahassee, Florida (hereinafter referred to as the "Division"), and the City of Jacksonville. The State of Florida received these grant funds from the Federal government, and the Division has the authority to subgrant these funds to the Sub-Recipient upon the terms and conditions outlined in the Subaward Agreement.

For the purposes of this Agreement, the Division serves as the pass-through entity for the Federal award, and the Sub-Recipient serves as the recipient of a subaward.

The period of performance, as approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), shall last no longer than 36 months from the date of contract execution. The Agreement between the Division and the City of Jacksonville shall end on August 31, 2027.



The total estimated cost of the project is \$145,950.00, with the federal share providing 75% of the funding for this project \$109,462.50 and the local share being \$36,487.50
