RESOLUTION 2024-702-A

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE PERIOD OF SEPTEMBER 15 THROUGH OCTOBER 15, 2024, AS HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Hispanic heritage of what would become the United States of America began long before any permanent European settlements were established, when Spanish explorers and conquistadors began exploration of the New World in the Caribbean and Mexico and reached what is now the southern United States; and

WHEREAS, the oldest continuously inhabited European settlement in North America was established in St. Augustine in 1565 by Pedro Menéndez de Avilés, a Spanish military officer; and

WHEREAS, from 1565 to the present, the influence of Hispanic citizens has been profound both in the United States and in Jacksonville where, as of the latest Census Bureau estimates, persons identifying as Hispanic make up 12.6% of the city's population, and is the third largest identifiable ethnic group in the city; and

WHEREAS, citizens of Hispanic heritage have had a profound impact on our city's business, cultural, political and social scenes since its founding. They operate successful businesses, serve in the armed forces, hold public office, participate in numerous community benefit organizations and activities, tantalize our tastebuds with delicious and varied cuisines exemplifying their cultural heritage, and enliven our cultural scene with all manner of visual and performing arts; and

WHEREAS, in September 1968 President Lyndon Johnson issued the first Hispanic Heritage Week proclamation, and the celebration was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a month from mid-September to mid-October, which encompasses the time period when numerous Hispanic countries declared their independence from Spain; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to recognize and celebrate the profound impact that Jacksonville's Hispanic population has had on our city's culture and history; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby declares the period from September 15 through October 15, 2024, as Hispanic Heritage Month in Jacksonville and urges all citizens to seek out, recognize and enjoy the influence that Hispanic culture continues to have on our city's quality of life.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
