RESOLUTION 2025-112-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF FORMER CITY COUNCIL MEMBER FORREST FINCH BOONE AND EXTENDING CONDOLENCES TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HIS PASSING; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Forrest Finch Boone, a native of Miami, was educated at Miami Country Day School, Coral Gables High School and The Hill School in Pottstown, Pennsylvania before earning his bachelor's degree in criminology and religion at Florida State University, where he met his wife Barbara and together they made their home in Neptune Beach; and

after graduation, Mr. Boone joined the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office as a correctional officer specializing in crisis intervention before being encouraged by friends to run for and win a seat on the City Council in 1979 representing the Beaches and East Arlington (then District 1) and subsequently was reelected in 1983 to a renumbered District 3 also representing the Beaches; and

during his tenure on the City Council, Forrest Boone was proud to pursue policies advocating for smart growth strategies and to secure funding for needed projects in his district, most notably the construction of the Beaches Branch Library in Neptune Beach; and

WHEREAS, while on the City Council, Mr. Boone served as a member on several of the Standing Committees, was appointed to the Duval County Tourist Development Council, the Jacksonville Waterways

Commission and the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization, chaired the Council's Jail Task Force that selected the site for the current John Goode Pre-Trial Detention Center, cosponsored a resolution calling on the City to relocate the City Hall, Duval County Courthouse and jail from the riverfront so the land could be redeveloped for better uses and also served terms as the Council's Chaplain and Floor Leader; and

WHEREAS, following his City Council service, Forrest Boone moved to Tallahassee for a career in mortgage banking, real estate development and the establishment of a non-profit housing foundation that combined available governmental resources to enable homeownership for hundreds of working families; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Boone was a devoted family man, a skilled outdoorsman, a committed bible study leader and vestryman of St. Peter's Anglican Cathedral in Tallahassee, and a storyteller both in person and in print. He lived a long and fulfilling life and was deeply loved by his family and friends; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of former City Council Member Forrest Finch Boone, particularly his service to the Council and the citizens of Jacksonville during his elective service. The Council extends its sincere condolences on his passing to Mr. Boone's family, friends and admirers.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
