A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY'S APPLICATION TO HOST THE FLORIDA MUSEUM OF BLACK HISTORY; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, St. Johns County, recognizing the historical significance and cultural heritage of the African American experience in Northeast Florida, has proposed to host the Florida Museum of Black History; and

WHEREAS, the proposed location in St. Johns County, specifically near the historic site of the City of St. Augustine, is the oldest continuously occupied European settlement in the United States and possesses a rich narrative of African American history; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County has demonstrated through detailed planning and extensive community support, as outlined in their proposal, the appropriateness of this location for the museum, which will serve as a central hub for cultural education and tourism in Florida and the Southeastern United States; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Florida Museum of Black History in St. Johns County is expected to enhance regional economic development, boost tourism, and provide educational resources through the promotion of historical and cultural heritage; and

WHEREAS, the proposed museum location benefits from strong transportation infrastructure, including proximity to major highways and airports, ensuring accessibility for visitors both regional and national; and

WHEREAS, the proposal has garnered widespread support from educational institutions, local governments, and community organizations, affirming the collaborative spirit and commitment of the region to honor and explore African American history and contributions; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby supports St. Johns County's application to host the Florida Museum of Black History, recognizing the educational, economic, and cultural benefits of this proposal. The Council further directs the Chief of the Legislative Services Division to forward copies of this adopted resolution to the Chair of the Florida Museum of Black History Task Force, the Governor, the President and Minority Leader of the Florida Senate, and the Speaker and Minority Leader of the Florida House of Representatives to express the unified support of Jacksonville in this significant cultural initiative.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction

by the Florida Museum of Black History Task Force at its next meeting

on May 21, 2024.
