7 AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING A CONTINUATION GRANT;
8 APPROPRIATING \$496,965.00 (\$372,723.75 FROM
9 THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA)
10 THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY
11 MANAGEMENT (FDEM) AND A 25% CITY MATCH OF
12 \$124,241.25 FROM GENERAL FUND GSD) UNDER THE
13 HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM TO ACQUIRE AND
14 DEMOLISH A FLOOD-PRONE PROPERTY AND RETURN IT
15 TO GREEN SPACE, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T.
16 19-100; AMENDING THE 2019-2023 FIVE-YEAR
17 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROVED BY
18 ORDINANCE 2018-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR
19 THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION & DEMO OF
20 FLOODPRONE PROPERTY - OAKWOOD DRIVE";
21 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND
22 THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND
23 DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE
24 FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT
25 BETWEEN FDEM AND CITY OF JACKSONVILLE;
26 PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY EMERGENCY
27 PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; REQUIRING QUARTERLY
28 REPORTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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30 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

1 owners. The Project is an acquisition/demolition project that will
2 remove the structure from the threat of future flood damages.
3 Acquisition and demolition is the most effective means to protect
4 against flooding and has been promoted as the preferred method of
5 reducing flood risks. The completion of the Project will reduce
6 future public costs to county, state, and federal agencies that
7 provide, among other things, evacuation and rescue, emergency
8 shelter, and debris removal services. The Project will also remove
9 the current residents from the immediate dangers of flooding. The
10 Subject Property will be returned to green space, thus improving
11 local flood storage and conveyance. Finally, the Subject Property
12 will be deed-restricted so as not to allow a new structure that
13 inevitably would be damaged by future flooding to be built.

14 **Section 3. CIP Amendment.** Ordinance 2018-505-E, being the
15 2019-2023 Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the City and
16 certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide
17 funding for the project entitled "Acquisition & Demo of Floodprone
18 Property - Oakwood Drive." The project is more fully described in
19 the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit**
20 **2**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Revised CIP, August 19, 2019 -
21 NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council
22 finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next
23 annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best
24 interests of the community because such deferral will delay
25 urgently needed mitigation. Pursuant to Section 122.605(c),
26 *Ordinance Code*, enactment of this ordinance requires the
27 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Council members present at
28 the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section.
29 This ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2018-505-
30 E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement
31 Program approved by Ordinance 2018-505-E shall continue in full

1 force and effect.

2 **Section 4. Authorization to execute.** The Mayor, or his
3 designee, and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to
4 execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Federally-
5 Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement between the Florida Division of
6 Emergency Management (FDEM) and the City of Jacksonville, in
7 substantially the same form placed **on file** with the Office of
8 Legislative Services (the "Agreement").

9 **Section 5. Oversight.** The Emergency Preparedness
10 Division of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department will
11 provide oversight.

12 **Section 6. Reporting.** Consistent with 2 C.F.R. § 200.238,
13 the City of Jacksonville (the "Sub-Recipient") shall provide FDEM
14 quarterly reports and a close-out report. These reports shall
15 include the current status and progress by the Sub-Recipient and
16 all subcontractors in completing the work described in the Scope of
17 Work and the expenditure of funds under the Agreement, in addition
18 to any other information requested by FDEM.

19 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become
20 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
21 without the Mayor's signature.
