- Authorizes Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program (DPRP) Forgivable Loans of \$1,251,430, subject to future appropriation by Council
- DPRP funding will be used to renovate and rehabilitate the building located at 525 W. Beaver Street into a minimum of 12 residential units/7,300 sq. ft. of leasable residential space (which the Developer intends to use as short term housing) and a minimum of 1,300 square feet of leasable commercial/retail space for tenants
