- The exemption amount will be equal to either 75% or 100% of the assessed value, depending on the percentage of units used for affordable housing within a development
- The Neighborhoods Department will be responsible for developing, receiving, and reviewing applications for the exemption
- The exemption period will begin with the 2024 tax roll and will expire December 31, 2026 unless extended by Council prior to that date. Extensions are effective for a three-year time period.
- The listing of properties eligible for this exemption will be finalized by March 1, 2024 and the financial impact on ad valorem revenue for FY 24/25 is undetermined at this time
