- Complete comprehensive crime reduction inventory

- Develop comprehensive capital reinvestment plan

- Revisit pre-consolidation commitments

- Develop and fund a comprehensive resiliency strategy for natural disasters, economic disruptions, and environmental threats

- Establish and fund initiatives making Jacksonville a very clean city attractive to visitors
