- (3) On page 2, line 1, strike "those";
- (4) On page 2, line 10-14, strike in its entirety and insert "Section 2. The Council also hereby expresses its outrage over recent attacks on law enforcement officers and states its desire that perpetrators of such assaults be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."
- (5) On page 1, line 1, amend the introductory sentence to add that the bill was amended as reflected herein.

## RESOLUTION 2021-395

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CITY COUNCIL'S STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE BRAVE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE JACKSONVILLE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN LIGHT OF THE RECENT ATTACKATTACKS ON AN ON DUTY OFFICERLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS; URGING THAT THE PERPETRATOR PERPETRATORS OF THE ATTACKSUCH ATTACKS BE PROSECUTED TO THE FULLEST EXTENT OF THE LAW; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, enrecent reports have alerted the evening of June 3rd a Jacksonville Sheriff's Office deputy responded to a report of shots being fired in the Riverside area north of I 10. Cellphone video posted by a witness on a Twitter account and subsequently reposted and widely circulated shows that officer attempting to take a potential suspect into custody and then being tackled and beaten by another person as a crowd stood by and watched; and

whereas, law enforcement officers, including the brave women and men of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, put their lives on the line each and every day to protect and defend the safety and security of each of us, and are deserving of our deepest respect, admiration and support; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council recognizes and honors

the commitment and dedication of JSO officers to their duty and to the well-being of our community, and believes that attacks on those officers are despicable and the perpetrators should be brought swiftly to justice; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby expresses its strong support and undying gratitude to the brave women and men of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office for their bravery, dedication to duty, and countless actions, large and small, to protect and assist the citizens of Jacksonville.

Section 2. The Council also hereby expresses its outrage over the recent attacks on a Sheriff's Office deputy who was attempting to protect the Riverside communitylaw enforcement officers and requests states its desire that the perpetrator of the assault on that officersuch assaults be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
