WHEREAS, it is the intention of the City Council that the financial health of Jacksonville be one of the highest priorities; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of City Council to communicate its budgetary priorities to the Administration so that these areas may be considered during the budget building process; and

18 WHEREAS, it is the Council's desire that these areas be 19 considered for additional investment to the extent that revenues 20 exceed expenses after taking into account mandatory cost increases, 21 inflation, those budgetary targets and requirements set forth in the 22 municipal code and other critical needs as determined during the 23 budget review and preparation process; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2021-893-E was approved by Council which enacted the Council's 1, 3, and 5-year priorities as the Council's Strategic Plan; and

27 WHEREAS, in year one, a goal for the Public Service Grant was28 included; and

WHEREAS, the Council enacted separate legislation in Ordinance 30 2021-851-E to address the Public Service Grant and budget 31 appropriation; and WHEREAS, the Council desires to move a year three goal of sending after school care into year one as there now seems to be capacity; and

WHEREAS, the Council seeks to have the 1-year Strategic Plan
incorporated as the top budget priorities for the 2022-2023 fiscal
year; and

7 WHEREAS, to the extent practicable, the Council requests the 8 recurring costs referenced in the below priority areas be considered 9 by the Administration for funding without the use of one-time 10 reserves; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The Council has deliberated and debated the top priorities and hereby submits the priorities of the City Council attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

15 Section 2. The Council further encourages the Mayor to 16 incorporate the Council priorities into the 2022-2023 budget for the 17 consolidated government of the City of Jacksonville.

18 Section 3. Effective Date. This resolution shall become 19 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 20 without the Mayor's signature.

One Year Goals (2022-2023)

- 1. Provide \$200,000 for workforce industrial training. (\$200,000)
- 2. Improve neighborhood small business corridors. (\$450,000: \$150,000 Year one, \$150,000 Year Two, \$150,000 Year Three)
- 3. Implement meaningful, placemaking public art for each of the 14 Council Districts. (\$1,400,000: \$100,000 per Council District)
- 4. Focus efforts on after school and summer programming. (\$3,000,000)
- 5. Support streamlining and increase funding, fair practices, and funding floor for the Public Service Grant Council, expanding criteria for diversity initiatives and community grants accountability. **(2021-851; Encourages \$5.5 million in annual budget)**
- 6. Resume recycling collections. (On February 7, 2022, Council President established "Special Committee on Solid Waste" to address recycling and solid waste issues)
- 7. Facilitate a community conversation to develop a roadmap and funding plan to be completed by July 2022 for removal, relocation, remaining, or renaming of all confederate monuments on city property. **(Council will deliberate further action)**
