2023-333 Riverside Ave between Stockton Ave and Osceola Street: vehicles are flooded out and multiple JSO Teams are called on-site to re-direct traffic and assist.



Bill 2023-351 Amendment offered by CM Boylan

Amendment Summary

City Council previously approved two FIND Grant projects related to the design and construction of a dock and park facilities on Reed Island. The table below reflects the amounts budgeted for this project. This project will no longer move forward as the City is proposing to convey the Reed Island property to the Harbour Waterways Dependent Special District through bill 2023-351. In exchange for the conveyed property, Harbour will construct improvements and the property will be used as a publicly accessible park in perpetuity. As a result of the projects not moving forward, there are unspent City matching dollars of \$450,000 that are no longer needed and the project budgets need to be adjusted. The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department recommends using unspent City match dollars of \$375,000 to address a funding shortfall in the Reed Island design phase project (\$39,681.59) and to partially fund the Joe Carlucci Boat Ramp Fishing Pier (\$335,318.41). Note that this will leave a remaining balance of \$75,000 in unspent City match dollars for a future planned appropriation.

The amendment will add appropriation language to the bill to make the necessary budgetary adjustments and attach a BT and CIP Sheets.
