Dear Jacksonville City Council Members,

First I would like to thank you for all you do for the betterment of our wonderful city. With this email I would like to present new information in the interest of restarting a process largely ineffective before the shutdown, At this time I look forward to learning alongside you all how to navigate the 5G (small cell wireless) situation, and helping equip people with accurate and reliable information on the subject of 5G.

During the past six months our STOP 5G Jax group has grown and organized, and with help from expert resources outside Jacksonville I am eager to share the following info with you now:

Kindly note that between 2015 and 2019, both wireline and wireless internet transmissions fell under FCC Title II, regulated as "Telecommunications Services" under the 1996 Telecommunications Act (TCA). However, on October 1, 2019, the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals in Case No, 18-1051, Mozilla et al. v. FCC, confirmed Internet "Services" to be reclassified by the FCC as Title I, unregulated "Information Services." At present, only wireline and wireless telephone and text transmissions are classified as Title II, regulated "Telecommunications Services." This regulatory distinction means that no federal preemption applies to wireless facility applications purposed for internet transmissions. Title I and Title II applications, therefore, need to be regulated differentially by planning and zoning: for example, with separate file cabinets. Indeed, instead of permitting these, some local governments are supplying public fiber-optics to the premises (FTTP) for internet, which is superior in every way to wireless internet transmissions. Fiber provides the fastest, clearest signal over the greatest distances. Reliable in storms and emergencies, it is not only unhackable, it is extremely energy-efficient, emitting no radiation. A decision for public FTTP can also enrich the local economy while preserving the quiet enjoyment of streets.

Our Jacksonville ordinance, however, stands in opposition to this long and recently confirmed federal distinction. At Chapter 350.81, the language astonishingly folds "communications", "telecommunications" and "information" data into one definition:

350.81 Communications services offered by governmental entities.—(h) "Telecommunications services" means the transmission of signs, signals, writing, images, sounds, messages, data, or other information of the user's choosing, by wire, radio, light waves, or other electromagnetic means, without change in the form or content of the information as sent and received by the user and regardless of the facilities used, including, without limitation, wireless facilities.

And, despite "5", no consideration has been given to public health which, as we've seen per covid, is preeminent, requiring the closure of businesses when threatened.

The private and public costs and benefits of providing the service by a private entity or a governmental entity, including the effect (sic) on existing and future jobs, actual economic development prospects, tax-base growth, education, and public health.

Notwithstanding s. <u>542.235</u> or any other law, a governmental entity that provides a communications service is subject to the same prohibitions applicable to private providers under ss. <u>542.18</u> and <u>542.19</u> as it relates to providing a communications service...

These are a few of the problems rendering our ordinance inconsistent with federal law, resulting in antenna placement, construction and operations the US Congress specifically aimed to prohibit under TCA: residential. See the Congress's Conference Report on TCA, attached. We must halt at once the current deployment with a moratorium and revise our ordinance so it accords with federal laws and their intents.
