23-425	Amendment	(ORD-Q Rezoning at 0 Dames Point Crossing Blvd, btwn Merrill Rd & Dames Point Crossing Blvd N from PUD (2003-192-E) to PUD, to Permit Commercial Retail Sales & Svcs & Warehousing Uses, as Described in the Dames Point Crossing Auto PUD):  1. Rezoning approved with the following conditions:  a. Any applicable permitted use shall meet the additional performance standards outlined in Section 656.399.62.E.4 of the Zoning Code.  b. The PUD and adjacent parcels may have cross access agreements to share the proposed access points. The final location and number of access points is subject to the review and approval of the City's Traffic Engineer and Planning and Development Department.  c. The maximum lot coverage for any lot within the development shall be 35%.  d. No bay doors facing the frontage of Dames Point Crossing Blvd.  e. Rezoning does not impact covenants or restrictions pursuant to 2003-192-E  2. Attaches a Revised Exhibit 3 (revised PUD Written Description dated November 1, 2023).  3. Attaches a Revised Exhibit 4 (revised PUD Site Plan dated February 1, 2024).

Attaches the Revised Exhibit 3 (revised PUD Written Description dated April 2, 2024) to include exhibits that reflect revisions to the original PUD (1999-804-E) exhibits.
24-145	Amendment	(ORD-Q Rezoning at 12636 & 12640 Ivylena Rd, btwn Girvin Rd & Southern Rose Dr from RR-Acre to PUD, to Permit Up to 65 Townhomes, as Described in the Aveline Trail PUD):  1. Rezoning approved with the following conditions:  a. Within the required 15 foot buffer on the East, West and Southern borders, existing trees and the remaining undisturbed natural buffer will be retained.  b. No second story balconies.  c. Remove lot #57.  d. Revise written description and site plan dated 4/2/24; update the bill to reflect at total of 64 units in the subdivision.  e. 8 foot fence on Southern border of property, with 6 foot fence on East and West boundaries as required by Landscape Code.

24-168	Amendment	(ORD Transferring \$802,300.54 in Federal Grant Funds from Permanent & Probationary Salaries & Associated Fringe Benefits to Contractual Svcs to Expand the City's Existing Contract with Family Foundations of Northeast Florida, Inc. to Provide Intervention & Prevention Svcs to High Risk Participants):  1. Clarify that \$22,175.54 of the reallocated grant funds will be used for pension costs for a grant-funded position and \$780,125 will be used for contractual services.  2. Clarify that the contractual services funding will be used for a new contract with Family Foundations, not expansion of an existing contract.  3. Clarify that the Family Foundations contract will be for a not to exceed amount of \$1,348,456 (\$568,331 of which was previously appropriated by Ord. 2023-188-E).  4. Attach Revised Exhibit 3 (Family Foundations contract) to correct the format from a grant agreement to services contract, correct the term, maximum indebtedness, scope, and budget, and incorporate the federal award conditions.  5. Update recording reference to include Official Record Book 3073, Page 731.  2. Page 1, line 13 and 30, strike "an" and insert "a non-exclusive".
24-207	Amendment	(ORD Approp \$500,000.00, Including \$250,000.00 in Grant Funds Awarded by the FL Dept of Environmental Protection, Office of Resilience & Coastal Protection, & \$250,000.00 from the City Resiliency Infrastructure Improvements Proj Fund for the City Match, for the Huguenot Memorial Park - Shoreline Enhancement Proj):  1. Pg. 1, line 11 and pg. 2, line 6: strike "FUND".  2. Attach revised Exhibit 2 (CIP sheets) to correct previous funding amount for the Resiliency Infrastructure Improvements project.
24-208	Amendment	(ORD Auth the Mayor, or Her Designee, & the Corp Sec to Execute: (1) an Amendment 1 to Amended & Restated Redev Agrmt btwn & (2) Restated Lease Agrmt btwn the City & Armory Redevelopment Associates, LLC, to Extend the Contingency Period to Obtain Zoning & Financing for the Improvements):  1. Correct scrivener's errors.

Clarify that participating hospitals are located within Duval County.  4. Correct scrivener's errors.

Clarify financial information required to be submitted for tax exempt agencies and strike reference to submittal of Form 1023.
