22-416	Amendment	(ORD Reapprop \$94,875,967.35 from CIPs that have been Certified Complete by the Director of Public Works & Closed, Their Residual Balances Returned to the Source or Sources of Origin, & Placed in a Contingency Account, Transferring \$38,920,804.62 btwn Expense Accounts Among Various Projs within the Better Jax Plan Fund to Complete Outstanding Projs as Described in the Work Plan, & Auth Borrowing from the City's Commercial Paper Facility &/or Issuance of Fixed-Rate Debt in the Cumulative, Not-To-Exceed Amt of \$85,063,552.37): 1. Correct dollar figures to reflect amounts being appropriated to complete the remaining \$278 million of BJP projects. 2. Correct borrowing amount increase from \$85,063,552.37 to \$154,869,342.48. 3. Attach Revised Exhibit 1 (Projects to be funded via borrowing) to include additional projects. 4. Attach Revised Exhibit 2 (BT) to reflect updated project costs funded through an increase in borrowing and re-appropriating dollars within current BJP projects. 5. Attach Revised Exhibit 3 (Budget Ord. B4 borrowing schedules) to reflect increase in borrowing. 6. Attach Revised Exhibit 4 (CIP Sheets) to reflect changes in project funding to match BT.
22-574	Substitute	(ORD-MC Amending Chapt 804 (Jacksonville Traffic Code), Ord Code, to Create a new Pt 17 (Pedestrian & Vehicle Safety); Prov a Statement of Legislative Intent; Prov Procedures for Enforcement; Prov for Penalties): 1. Amends Sections 804.806 (Pedestrians walking where sidewalks are not provided; not to solicit rides; certain charitable solicitations allowed) and 804.807 (Charitable solicitations by permit) to: a. Modify the permitting process for charitable solicitation along designated roadways and establish permitting for indigent persons and other non-commercial solicitors. b. Reduce the age of allowed solicitation participants from 21 to 18 c. Move oversight of the permitting process from the Neighborhoods Department to the Public Works Department. d. Extend permit period from 48 hours to 72 hours. e. Expand regulation of pedestrians walking in a roadway to also include riders of animals. 2. Creates a new section 804.1701 (Pedestrian and Vehicle Safety) to: a. Make it unlawful for pedestrians to occupy or remain in a median for an extended period of time, physically interact with occupant of a motor vehicle while on the traveled portion of a designated roadway, or utilize public right-of way for commercial use. b. Provide for exemptions including law enforcement, fire and rescue, or other government employees or contractors acting within the scope of their lawful authority, and

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		a person performing inspection, construction, maintenance, survey, or other legally authorized services.
		c. Establish an exemption for a person or entity in possession of a valid solicitation
		permit.
		d. Specify penalties and citation procedures, including a civil penalty of up to \$100.3. Repeals Section 250.118 (Newspaper street sales allowed).
		4. Gives the Traffic Engineering Division 90 days to develop criteria for issuing permits.
		5. Designates that the first 30 days after enactment shall be a public education period with
		only warnings being issued.

		1. Revises the revenue appropriation to \$388,083.85, consisting of investment pool earnings (\$290,052.27) and interest income (\$98,031.58) available in the Northbank CRA Trust Fund as of 9/30/22.
		2. Revises the expenditure appropriation to be allocated to future year debt reduction
		(\$100,000.00) and the Commercial Revitalization Program (\$288,083.85).
		3. Attaches a Revised Exhibit 1 (BT) to reflect the updated appropriation as explained
		above.

		Traffic Engineering Division, the Chief of the Transportation Division and the traffic
		reviewer from Development Services. Furthermore, although the site does not directly
		access a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) right-of-way, the trips caused by the
		development will impact the FDOT Lem Turner Road/Hemlock Street intersection. Therefore, Florida Department of Transportation representation should also be included in
		the methodology meeting.
